New Business

Tour Applegate Trail

Staff and board members met at the Applegate Trail trailhead located on the corner of SW 8th Street and Sims Drive. Erin Rushing, Executive Director of NWA Trailblazers, was present to assist with the tour and answer any questions about the new trail. David informed board members that the trail was approximately 30-45 days from completion. Staff and board members next started the tour of Applegate Trail, which consisted of a bike ride down to the north trailhead located at NW 3rd Street. David informed the board that this trail is 12ft wide, which will be the standard width for all new trails in Bentonville. Erin mentioned that this trailhead would have a parking lot with approximately 35 spaces. He also informed the board that the tunnel that goes under NW 3rd Street will be painted and have lights. Stephen George asked if we were concerned about this tunnel flooding. David replied that this tunnel could flood, similar to our other tunnels, but the water shouldn't sit in the tunnel due to the natural slope.

Staff and board members next took the Applegate Trail into Coler Mountain Bike Preserve. David informed the board that our staff would maintain the Applegate Trail, but the Coler trails are privately owned and maintained. He reminded the board that this is similar to Compton Gardens and the Crystal Bridges Trail.
