Timeline for design, fabrication and installation

Design plan will take a few weeks, I plan to have the students experiment with colors found in various nature sources (hair, eyes, plants, dirt...) to see which color combinations they like best for the bubbles. Painting it will take a week or so to get each pillar drawn, base layered, and then let the students come out and paint their bubbles.

Ongoing maintenance requirements

A touch up might be needed in a few years

Narrative (describe the inspiration for the artwork and how it contributes to the visitor's experience) Based off Dorena Williamsons book "ColorFULL." I have chosen to inspire my students and our community to be less color blind to the people and world around them and more open and willing to see and experience the wonderful differences we were put on this earth to share. I want the viewers to not only experience a whimsical, childlike, happiness (because everyone loves bubbles) but to also be challenged to take in and appreciate the colors all around them. Colors of nature, skin, everything.

This is a painting I completed in College as a final project. I took this photo in 2002 from my backyard but I added a man falling in the clouds to signify how faith is a leap.

Trail Mural Concept by Chance Snider

The inspiration for this mural came from Dorena Williamson's book "ColorFull." I am in contact with Mrs. Williamson and working on how much of her book she will let us recreate. I would ask that you keep this in mind as any idea can be altered or changed. The pillars will not be completely covered in paint but the idea is for the areas being painted to enhance the beauty of the site.

The Idea is to "fill" the pillars with Bubbles. I plan to have select art students practice with different color mixtures to mimic the nature they see around them. They will gain inspiration from things like eye color, hair color, skin color, color of birds, water, trees/seasons, bugs, and anything from nature. Each student working on the painting will be responsible for mixing and painting at least one bubble.

On the following 3 of the pillars I would like to add figures (in addition to the bubbles).

The Main pillar (image 1) closest to the trail I would like to have a boy blowing bubbles (image2) similar to the one from the book and I also plan to have an inspirational quote (Granny Mac's words about being ColorFULL in image 3) from the book written in the middle of 3 of the bubbles (it would look like image 3.5)

On the Back Right (overlapped) Pillar (image 4) I plan to have a zoomed in view of a person blowing bubbles (the hand and wand – Image 5) this will wrap around the pillar with the face on the back side. (Viewable from Burns Arboritum trail).

Finally I plan to have a girl with a bubble blower (image 2) on the back of the closest pillar on the right

My goal is for this wrap around mural to connect and flow in away that the hikers can enjoy it from more than one view point. I want to use the whimsical fun bubbles to encourage hikers to admire the beauty all around their selves. My initial sketch image 6

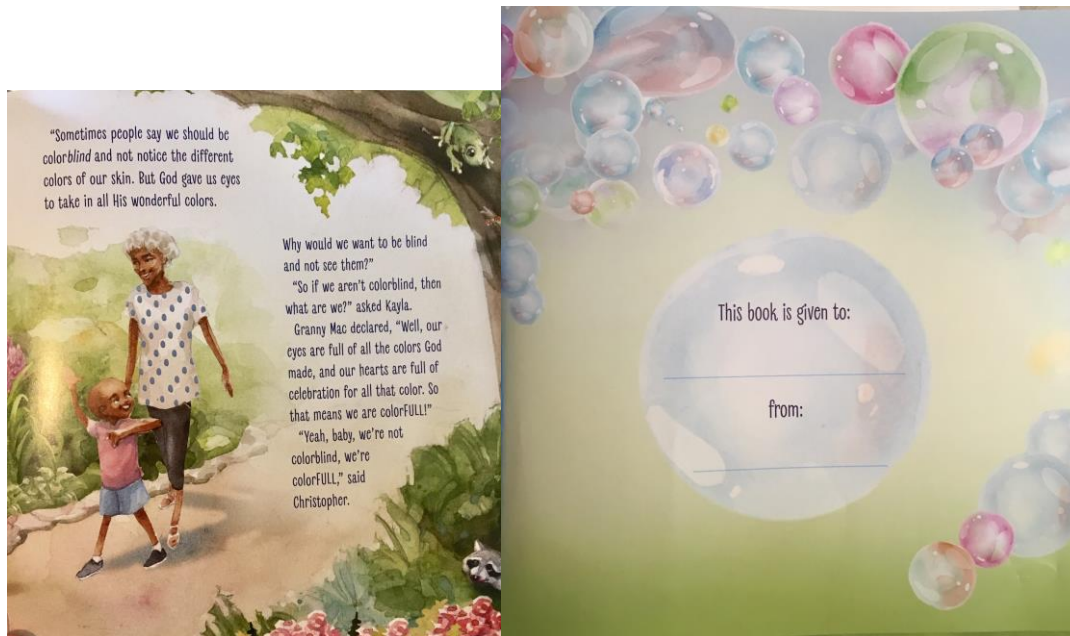


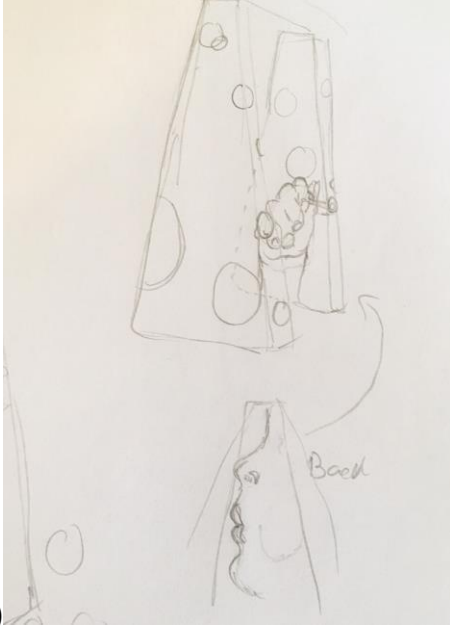
Main Pillar by the trail (image 1)



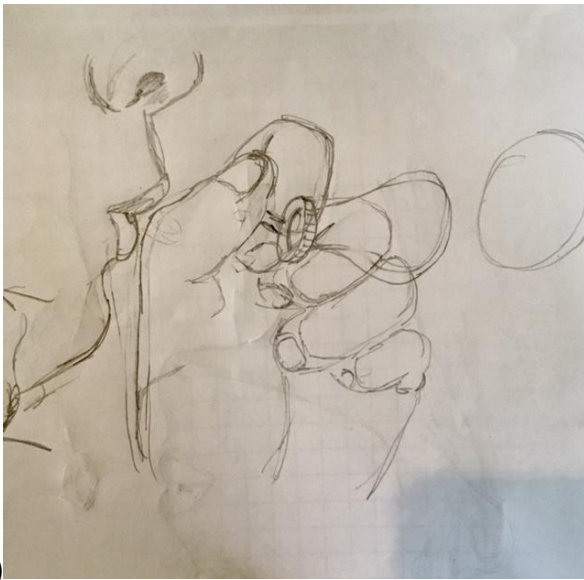

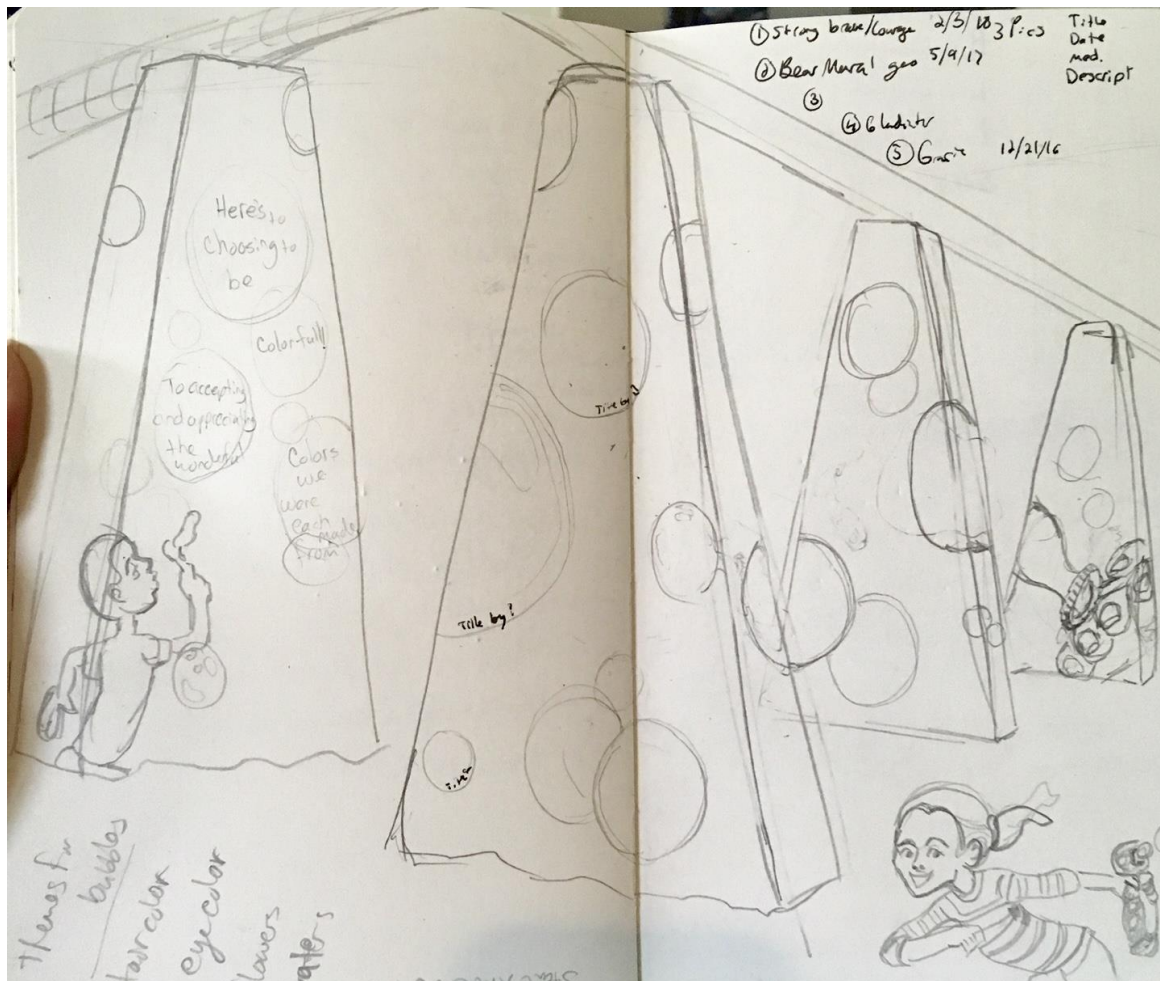

Looking For Something To Do? TRY ONE OF THESE:

GAMES

NINJA: Players stand in a tight circle, with feet in center, then yell “3-2-1-Ninja” and everyone jumps back. Players cannot move unless it is their turn. During a player’s turn they make one action (step, move arm, etc). The goal of the game is to tag other player’s arm anywhere below the elbow including their hand, once a player arm has been tagged they are out of the game.

BLOB TAG: Similar to normal tag except when a person has been tagged, the individual together with the one who tagged them join hands and run together to catch the next victim. Once they tag the next one, he/she has to join hands with them and they should all continue chasing after the others and so on. The game should continue until the last person, the winner, has been snared by the blob. Create a perimeter if on a vast playground and rule that anyone who goes past the boundary is immediately banned from continuing with the fun outdoor game.

EYE CONTACT SWITCH: One person is “it”, everyone else stands around the person in a circle. Those around the circle try to make eye contact with another person in the circle and switch spots. While the two people in the circle are trying to switch spots the person who is “it” tries to step into their spot in the circle. Whoever does not have a spot stays in the middle of the circle and is “it”.

NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM: Choose one player to be the guard, they will stand in the middle of the space. Everyone else should stand to one side of the room, or space. The guard is standing with their back to the players, the players are trying to make their way past the guard. When the guard thinks someone is moving they can turn around, if they catch a player in motion that player must return to the starting line. The goal of the game is to reach the guard.

CAT & MOUSE: Everyone stands in a circle and links arms with a partner, except for two players who will be the cat and mouse. The cat chases the mouse and tries to tag the mouse. The mouse tries to link arms with another player, once they have the person that was linked on the end now becomes the mouse. If the cat tags the mouse then the mouse and cat switch roles, and the cat gets to choose who the new mouse will be.

SHIPS & SAILORS: Pick one person to be captain. All players will stand in the center of the room, and when a command is called they must do the action. Here are some commands we recommend. • Left side of space is starboard, right side is port view. When called players must run to the side of the room that is called. • 4 Men Eating—4 players sit in a square and act like they are eating. • 3 Men rowing— 3 players sit in a row, and pretend to row a boat. • Captain Coming— Stand at attention, and do no other commands until the words “At ease” are said by the captain.

ART

HOW MANY COLORS CAN YOU SEE?

Investigate how each color is made. Remember that all colors stem from our primary colors of red, blue, and yellow.



Using items you can find at the park or around the park such as grass, leaves, and stones try creating an image of an animal or even yourself!

CHALLENGES

Find things in nature such as rocks, twigs, leaves, etc. and see how high you can stack them, or even if you can make a shelter that a small toy could live inside.

Using natural materials like leaves make a small glider that can soar through the air.

Layout a “course” with your friends through or around the playground and see who can go through it the fastest. Make sure to watch out for other kids!

The ground is “lava”. See if you can get from the entrance of the playground to another point such as the slide without touching the ground.
