Bentonville Parks and Recreation Monthly Report – November

Administration – David Wright

- **COVID-19**
 - Working daily with City Administration, Bentonville Police and Fire Departments, local health officials and other community leaders to monitor situation surrounding Covid-19
- **Lake Bentonville**
 - Successfully opened the renovated Lake Bentonville to the public on Friday, October 23. The 16 acre park now provides enhanced fishing and boating opportunities, play areas, pavilion, public art and trails.
- **Quilt of Parks**
 - Accepted approximately \$2,000,000 in grant awards for the A Street Promenade, Commons and Orchards Park Dog Park projects.
 - Hosted Kickoff meetings QOP Design projects. Designs for the A Street Promenade, Dave Peel and The Commons will take approximately 8-14 months to complete.
- **2021 Budget**
 - Worked with Mayor Orman and Finance Department to finalize the 2021 Operation Budget for Parks and Recreation. The budget will be presented to City Council in November.

Parks Maintenance – Crant Osborne

- **Mowing Crew**
 - The mowing team (5 staff) is primarily focused on the downtown Christmas lighting display. They moved from two (2) 65' articulating boom lifts in September to 80' lifts for October and early November. All canopied and wrapped trees are complete at the Square, Court House and Lawrence Plaza. Ground lights are following, and besides the three (3) existing 18-20' trees, a new 18' animated Christmas tree will fill in the void left by the statue and the lighting system that was designed for it. The team is working hard for an on time delivery. In addition to the lighting project, the crew is busy with leaf detail, reduced mowing, trail/tunnel closures and subsequent cleanup, and troubleshooting several trail counters.
- **Trail Maintenance**
 - The trail maintenance team of one is finishing up in Phase I (soft surface trails) and will be moving to Phase II East and then Phase II in November. Additionally, we have scouted the trails that are mapped out for The Oz Trails Black Apple Glow Ride for any last minute areas that may need attention. Tree removal on All American and Tadmaguchi.
- **Turf Specialist**
 - Focus on removing the 55 backflows and winterizing the irrigation lines the backflows serve. Assist with Christmas light display.

- **Horticulture Crew**
 - Horticulturists have completed summer annual removal and landscape bed preparation for fall annual and tulip bulbs (18,000). The install is presently under way, and will be complete by mid-November. This team will also assist with Christmas lighting display.
- **Sports Fields Crew**
 - The sports field team is balancing end of season mowing, field prep and field line painting for all of the fields, 60 team Spooker Classic/Monster Mash Tournament, and assisting with the Christmas lighting display.
- **Sanitation Team**
 - Besides routine maintenance, which is never routine, the sanitation crew is assisting with the ice rink installation at Lawrence Plaza, and providing the highest level of cleaning and sanitizing possible in response to Covid-19 as well as the remaining events of the season. New hire Kenny Baker recently joined the team and all are pleased with the level of experience and enthusiasm he brought with him from his previous position at the U of A. Sanitation also assists with the Christmas lighting project.
- **Urban Forester**
 - Geoff is presently working on the 2020-2021 WFF tree planting project, Parks Conservancy November work day planning, tree transplanting at Old Tiger (November 4), 28th Street Park landscape plan review, City park tree inventory, and fall fertilizer planning.
- **Facility Maintenance Team**
 - Restriped the tunnel at Park Springs for safety purposes
 - Preparing Lawrence plaza for ice skating as well as Christmas. The team painted all of the light poles and bollards to give everything a fresh look.
 - Team is working to make sure all electricity is working properly on the square in anticipation of turning the lights on in November
 - Team prepared barriers at the Community Center between exercise equipment
 - Team assisted in the placement of the art project at Citizens Park playground
- **Community Center Custodial Staff**
 - Staff at the BCC has worked hard to ensure the building is clean and sanitized with a disinfectant to provide a welcoming environment to patrons and city staff.

Park Planning – Wade Tomlinson

- **Old Tiger Park**
 - The project has been turned over to the purchasing department for bid preparation.
- **8th Street Park**
 - The website is up and running. www.8gatewaypark.com. The site already has more than 1,000 comments. We will continue to collect data / comments for the next 2-3 weeks before finalizing design.
- **28th Street Park**
 - The design continues to be refined, cost are being reviewed by Flintco. As a normal course of business for land development, the next steps are to have the plans reviewed by other City departments for compliance to city standards.
- **Durham Park**
 - The purchase of the playground and PO have been approved. Next steps will be to set up the construction schedule.
- **Quilt of Parks**
 - The design and survey, budget and grant were approved by city council. A project schedule is being developed.
- **Razorback Greenway**
 - From Down Town to the Jacks Art piece at the NW A street trailhead will be restriped.
- **Orchards Park Playground and Dog Park**
 - The grant from the Walton Foundation has been accepted for the development of the park enhancements. Work on in house plans have begun.

Recreation Programming and Events – Josh Stacey

- **Bentonville Community Center**
 - The Community Center saw 8,600 users during October, an average of 318 users per day. The majority of users are swimmers and fitness participants.
- **Run Bentonville**
 - The Run Bentonville Reverse Half Marathon begins on November 1. Runners have the month of November to complete the half marathon distance by running the traditional course in reverse. Currently we have 201 runners registered.
- **Square 2 Square Bike Ride**
 - The bike ride ended registration with 1,447 registered riders. Bentonville swag bag pickup will be hosted at the 8th Street Market on November 5-7. Medals have been available for pickup for riders at various locations in Bentonville and Fayetteville.
- **Soccer**
 - Youth soccer was scheduled to complete the season on October 27 but due to rain the season was extended for Tuesday teams and will conclude on Nov 3.
 - We have received a lot of positive feedback on our schedule this season and not having organized play on Saturdays. We are surveying our parents to find out if there is support for this moving forward. While we will not be able to avoid Saturdays altogether, we may be able to offer a hybrid schedule where a team may not play every Saturday during the season.
- **Softball and Baseball**
 - We hosted the Pink Our Softball Tournament on October 1-4 w/ 66 total teams and the Recreation Series Championships on Oct 8-9 w/ 28 teams. The counts include both recreation and competitive teams.
 - The Spooker Classic Softball and Baseball Tournament will be held on Oct 31-Nov 1 and currently has 70 teams registered.

Lake Bentonville Tour

Before the walking tour began, David Wright discussed the progress of Lake Bentonville and gave a brief summary of the project. David shared with the members the NWA Trailblazers in collaboration with the Walton Family Foundation and Bentonville Parks and Recreation have created a conceptual 20 acre park with updated immunities. The playground and pavilion was replaced with a modern design which is also part of the 10 Year Masterplan. These enhancements will be at no cost to the City of Bentonville. The dam has been replaced and water will pass through onto Osage Creek which will increase the body of water we know as Lake Bentonville. This will allow for more recreation opportunities for the public and improve water quality. There is also a boat ramp that will allow entry into the water, with restrictions of course.

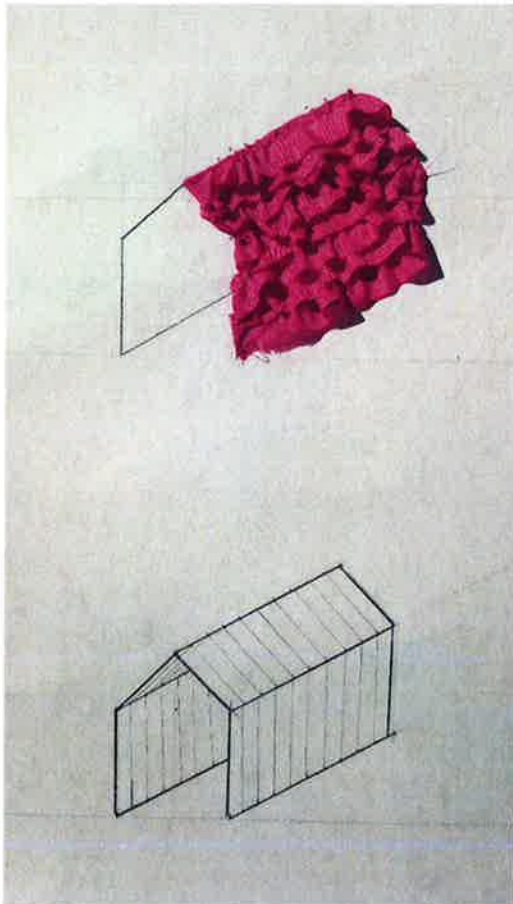

Guide These My Hands
By Traci Rae Manos & Danielle Hatch

Amended Display Location and Display Structure

One initial thought was to build a welded metal structure which the fabric could wrap around.

The structure would subtly evoke the farm house vernacular seen throughout rural areas of Benton County, with two walls and a gabled roof, wrapped on all sides with the gathered fabric and embroidered text of the poem. With this form we would allow the poem to create a sense of shelter and place (though the material itself would still be permeable to the weather) that viewers could walk through and around. The contrast of a reference to domestic space within the public sphere feels compelling and connected to our original focus on the lives of unsung women. Please see the initial sketches for a visual reference. The scale of the work in the image is 6' wide by 10' long by 9' tall at the center of the gable.



Description of Artwork

Project Overview

“Guide, these, my hands” is a temporary fabric and text-based sculpture. This artwork is a collaboration between sculptor, Danielle Hatch, and poet, Traci Rae Manos—both residents of Benton County. The medium for this work is waterproof fabric with hand-embroidered text and is intended for temporary outdoor display. The recommended display site is the South facing façade of the Benton County Circuit Court, located at 102 NE A St. The recommended display period is one year, with a suggested installation date of October 9, 2020.

The sculpture will consist of 120 yards of waterproof nylon sewn into a continuous ruffle and hand embroidered with the text of the poem, “Foothills Healer” (see full text below). The fabric color will be a deep violet, evoking the flower of the wild burdock plant, known for its medicinal properties. The fabric will be temporarily attached to the base of the building and organically wind its way up and envelope the facade of the structure in a joyful burst of color and movement. The fabric will temporarily attach to the architectural structure using a combination of steel cables suspended from the roof and elastic cords sewn into the fabric.

Project Narrative

“Guide, these, my hands” will build on the art and cultural experience in NWA by softening the edges of our public space and providing a counterpoint to the rigidity of the structures that currently make up our collective unconscious. The piece’s fabric construction, organic shape, and movement make it unique from public artwork currently on display in Bentonville. Because this tactile sculpture is composed of durable but lightweight fabric, it will move in response to wind, weather, and visitor interaction. As visitors draw near to this vibrant sculpture, touch the fabric, read and run their fingers over the hand-embroidered text, the “Guide, these, my hands” sculpture, will—in a sense—guide visitors’ hands to experience one of Bentonville’s public spaces in a newly personal, tactile, and sensorial way.

The proposed artwork reflects Bentonville history in that it celebrates the Ozark Mountains and traditional folk medicine practiced here. In contrast to the hard and cold facts often associated with history, this work tells the emotional history of the strength and resourcefulness of everyday Arkansas women—the mothers, daughters, sisters, grandmothers—who rarely appear in our history books. Many of these women relied on oral histories of native plant remedies passed down over generations to care for the health and well-being of their families and communities, especially in the days before physicians were readily available in the area. The compassion and resilience of these Arkansas women is evoked by the sculpture’s colorful, waterproof fabric that moves and bends in response to the elements but does not break.

The sculpture expresses Bentonville’s growing diversity by creating space for women’s voices. By amplifying and celebrating the voice of one unsung woman, a “healer” of the Ozark foothills, the piece speaks to the strength and compassion of all Arkansas women as they heal and tend to the needs of our diverse NWA community. The work also promotes community harmony by bringing the personal, the nurturing, and the compassionate into the public sphere. For a time,

this temporary installation will become part of a public building—the rigid and immobile, the organic and resilient—connecting and engaging in dialogue.

Foothills Healer

Make me of a quiet mind and steadfast heart.
Wake me before the sap rises in the pulp

and the buds spring forth, that I might sense
the first stem's quiver in my marrow. Then will

I rise early and take to the woods. I will lift mine
eyes to these hills from whence comes my help.

Guide these, my hands, to the sassafras and burdock,
to the blue burvene, dogwood and wild cherry,

so too, to the roots of sarsaparilla and mayapple.
For the physicians here are few and far-between.

The roads, likewise, slow-going. And it falls
on us women-folk to see to it that our neighbors

and loved ones are looked after in times of need—
whether they be young or old, sick or dying,

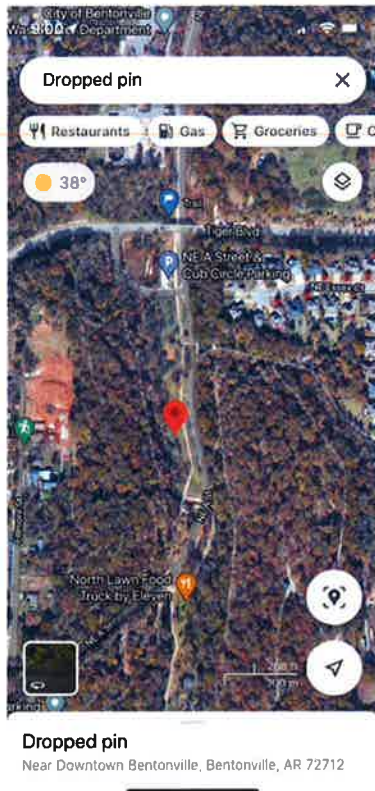
or with child. We are the night watchmen.

Box Turtle

Proposal for Placement at Slaughter Pen Mountain Bike Trails



The Runway Group of Northwest Arkansas is working with Bentonville Parks and Recreation Staff to propose the placement of a giant Box Turtle near the Slaughter Pen Mountain Bike Trails and the Razorback Greenway. Runway Group is proposing to donate this piece to the City of Bentonville. Working with Parks and Recreation Staff, we agree the location indicated above would provides an additional attraction to bring people to the trail system.

The piece is roughly 11' x 7' x 5'. It weighs approximately 800lbs. The artist is Stephen Fienbach of Eureka Springs. The turtle has hollow legs with blown glass inserts. Solar powered lights will be placed to back light the blown glass.

The Runway Group will provide this to Parks and Recreation / City of Bentonville at no cost. This donation includes delivery and installation.
