Requesting a 4-way stop at the intersection of NW 5th and NW “C” Street to help with speeding.

Tabled from May meeting. Tony Davis with Street Department to provide speed and traffic counts of this area. The Police Department was to provide additional enforcement.

Action: Traffic counting equipment failed, so counts were not obtained. Solutions discussed were to get fresh traffic counts after school starts. Camille Thompson would like us to look at the dynamic of the area. In the short term, it was Decided to re-evaluate signage, crosswalks, and markings. David Mills and Tony Davis Will work on this when school starts again. The Committee will re-visit this item at the September meeting. All Committee members agreed. No formal motion.

Action: Motion and second by Tony Davis and Dennis Birge to install a 3-way stop at Hollowbrook and Devonbrook within 2 weeks. Motion carried.

Action: Motion and second by Dennis Birge and Davis Mills to approve installing a sign that would say something to the effect of “For Safety Reasons, Parking is Available on Third Street”. Motion carried. In addition, David Mills will get with David Wright to work on verbiage for the sign.

Majority of traffic on East Central from J Street to the Square greatly exceeds 25 mph except during 4 pm – 6 pm on weekdays. We are requesting Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon at the crosswalk at F Street and East Central, a temporary portable speed trailer, and increased police speed enforcement.

Tabled from May meeting. Tony Davis to provide traffic counts and speeds. David Mills will look at additional signage needs. Police will increase patrol in the area.

Action: Motion and second by Dennis Birge and Tony Davis to: 1) increase enforcement of speed limit in the area; 2) Will look into the use of a portable speed trailer; and, 3) Look at the crosswalks from “J” to the Square, and install a “Reduce Speed Ahead” sign. Motion carried.

Requesting approval for construction of a raised mid-block crossing on MLK between SE 5th Street and SE 8th Street, per the attached Pedestrian Study by Walter P. Moore.

The crossing will provide pedestrian access between the proposed Walmart Layout Center and the future campus to the west.

Action: Motion and second by David Mills and Tony Davis to approve the location of the crosswalk, as designed with the refuge area, but without raised LSDC. Other design characters to be determined. Motion carried.

Mayor's Great Neighborhood's Program – Block parties, and possible criteria to meet in order for a neighborhood to request a street closure. See attached email.

There was discussion. The City typically does not approve the closure of city streets for a block party. The Committee would suggest finding another venue. Shelly will do some further research into this citing more discussion needs to happen before anything further is decided.

C. Councilman Octavio Sanchez appeared before the Committee and asked if, at Exit 86 from the bypass, on the right dual lane, vehicles could turn right on red after a stop? Dennis Birge said this is under the State's control and that we can ask them. Dennis will send in a request to clarify.

D. Tony Davis appeared with an item for discussion. He was suggesting that we purchase, through group funding, from Street, Police, Transportation, etc., two new Radar Trailers, as of the six (6) trailers we have currently, only two (2) are working. The proposed radar trailers (ATS-5 Trailer from All Traffic Solutions out of Virginia) have traffic counters, speed detail, and message boards. This would cost in the neighborhood of \$30,000. Tony will get with Ray Shastid from the Police Department about this.

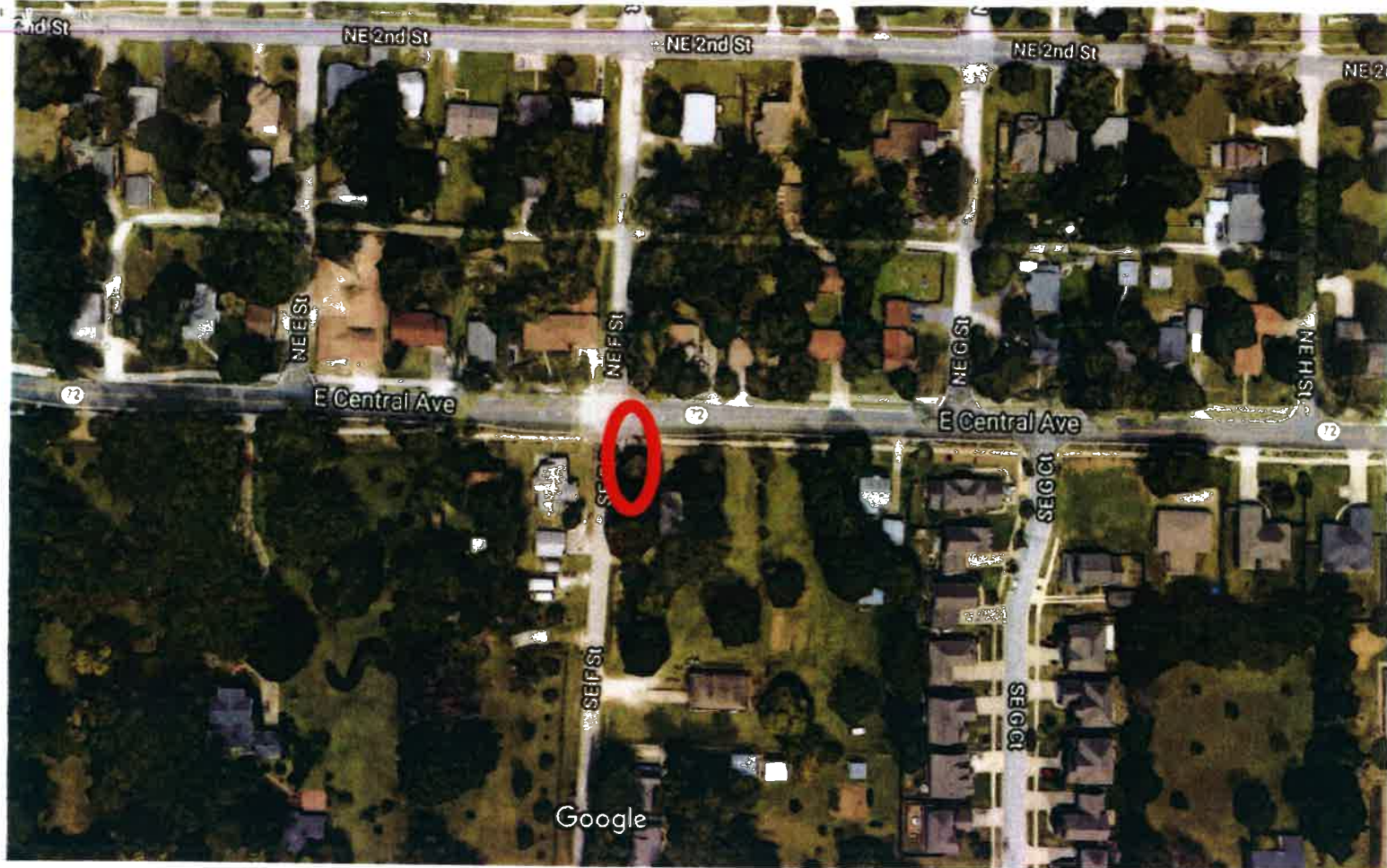

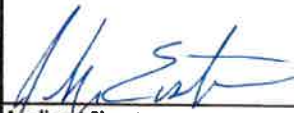

RE: Midblock Pedestrian Crossing Study – MLK Parkway

As part of the proposed Walmart campus, a mid-block pedestrian crossing is proposed across Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway (MLK) between 5th Street and 8th Street. This crossing will provide pedestrian access between the Layout Building east of MLK and the main campus west of MLK. The following study details if a marked mid-block crosswalk is appropriate.

PLANNED DEVELOPMENT

SITE DEVELOPMENT

The proposed Walmart campus will be located south of Central Avenue, north of Highway 102, east of J Street, and west of MLK. It will consist of numerous offices, parking garages, and other support facilities. The new Walmart campus will be home to a significantly larger number of employees than the existing facilities. The proposed campus is anticipated to open in 2024. In addition to the main campus a new Layout Building will be constructed east of MLK between 5th Street and 8th Street. Throughout the day, numerous employees will travel between the main campus and the Layout Building.

ROADWAY NETWORK

In addition to the existing roadway network, widening and extensions of existing streets will be completed with the campus construction.

MLK is planned to be a 4-lane roadway from Central Avenue south to 14th Street. For most of its length it will have a median or two-way left turn lane (TWLTL) separating the directions of traffic. Between 8th Street and 5th Street it will have a raised median. MLK will provide distribution north and south throughout campus. The speed limit on MLK is expected to be 35 mph.

MID-BLOCK CROSSING ANALYSIS

Mid-block crossings are often placed where there is heavy pedestrian traffic near major destinations. While there are no specific warrants for a midblock crossing, the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), Highway Capacity Manual, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), and National Association of City Transportation Officials (NACTO) all provide guidance on the installation of mid-block crossings and associated treatments.

MID-BLOCK CROSSING SHOULD BE MARKED WHERE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING OCCUR:

- Sufficient demand exists:
 - Near existing or proposed pedestrian generators
 - Existing or proposed pedestrian volumes greater than or equal to 20 per hour
 - Pedestrian crash history over several years
 - Location of nearest crosswalk is greater than 300 feet away
- Sufficient sight distance (greater than eight times the posted speed limit, **Table 1**).
- Safety considerations that do not preclude a crosswalk.

Table 1: Sight Distance

Posted Speed (mph)	Distance (ft)
20	160
25	200
30	240
35	280
40	320
45	360

MID-BLOCK CROSSWALKS ARE TYPICALLY NOT RECOMMENDED TO BE MARKED WHEN:

- On roads with four or more lanes with 12,000 Average Daily Traffic (ADT) without a median.
- On roads with four or more lanes with 15,000 ADT with a median, AND
- Posted speed limits are higher than 40 mph.

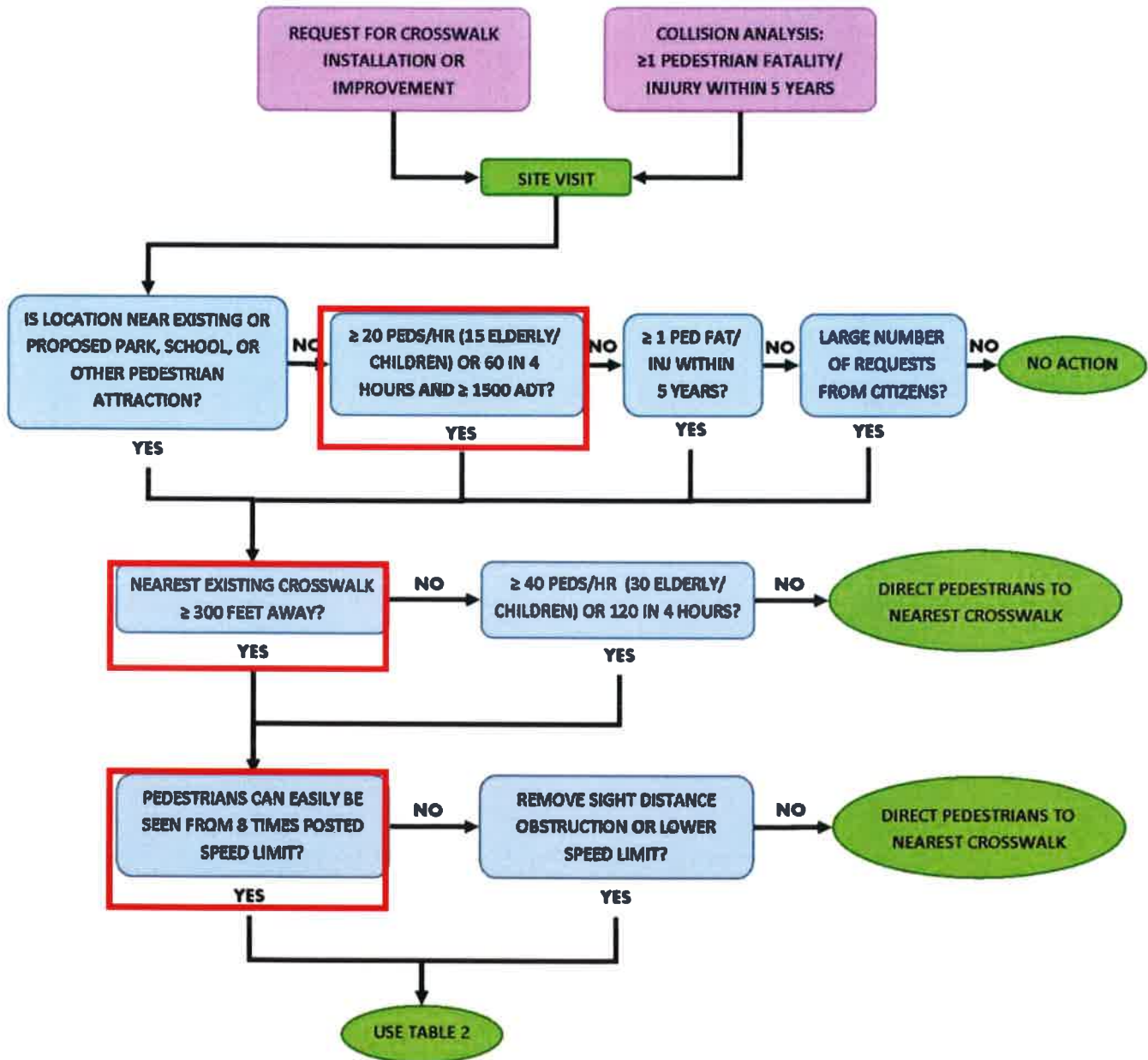


Figure 1: Steps to Pedestrian Crossing Location and Application

Figures 1 and **Table 2** depict the process to determine if a mid-block crossing is appropriate and what should be installed with a mid-block crossing.

NOTES

1. Raised Medians are assumed to have a cut-through that performs as a refuge for pedestrians.
2. Painted medians are not refuges for a pedestrian. A 4 foot wide raised median next to a left turn lane can only be considered a refuge if the left turn volume is less than 20 vph.
3. If parking is permitted along any roadway, consider installing bulb-outs at the crossing.

TREATMENT DESCRIPTIONS

A *Install marked crosswalk with W11-2 and W16-7P signs*

Specific Guidance: Install marked crosswalk with standard W11-2 and W16-7P signs mounted on the side of the roadway and additional W11-2 advanced pedestrian warning signs; use S1-1 signs for School Crossing locations.

* If an engineering study determines that obtaining a sufficient stopping sight distance based on the posted speed is impossible, consider using treatment C.

B *Install marked crosswalk with W11-2 and W16-7P signs and R1-6 in-street sign*

Specific Guidance: Install marked crosswalk with standard W11-2 and W16-7P signs mounted on the side of the roadway and additional W11-2 advanced pedestrian warning signs; where geometrically appropriate install R1-6 on a flexible in-roadway bollard. Use S1-1 signs for School Crossing locations.

* If an engineering study determines that obtaining a sufficient stopping sight distance based on the posted speed is impossible, consider using treatment C.

C *Install marked crosswalk with signs and pedestrian activated Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacons (RRFBs)*

Specific Guidance: Install marked crosswalk with standard W11-2 and W16-7P signs mounted on the side of the roadway WITH pedestrian activated RRFBs and additional W11-2 advanced pedestrian warning signs; use S1-1 signs for School Crossing location.

D *Do not install marked crosswalk at uncontrolled crossing. Determine if the speed limit can be effectively reduced to 40 mph AND a raised refuge median can be installed. If so utilize Scenario C criteria above. If this is not possible, consider HAWK signal or check signal warrants.*

Specific Guidance: Consider HAWK signal or pedestrian traffic signal. One will need to consider nearby signals, crossings, and other engineering factors.

SHADED *A pedestrian refuge island is recommended for consideration. Existing geometrics and project scope need to be considered*

Specific Guidance: Consider installing a curbed median or island with pedestrian refuge. Recommended median/island width is ≥ 8 feet, minimum is 4 feet. Additional signage per the MUTCD will be needed to advise drivers of the median or island.

SITE ANALYSIS

The proposed mid-block crossing location on MLK has the following characteristics:

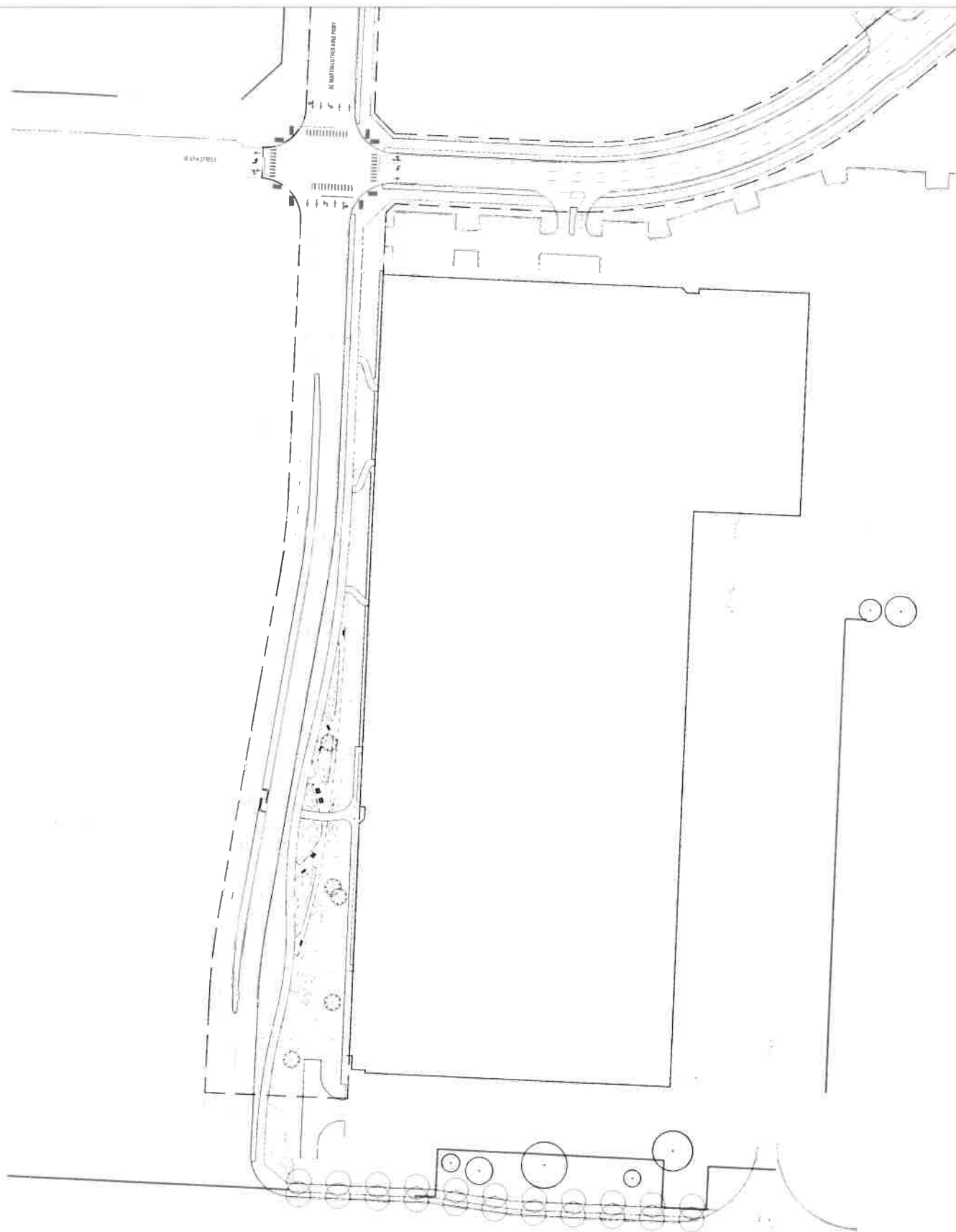
- Projected ADT: 13,000 to 15,000
- Projected pedestrians: 200 to 300 pedestrians between 8AM and 5PM = 25 per hour
- Posted speed: 35 MPH
- Five lanes with raised median
- Nearest crosswalks: 600 feet away at 5th Street and 8th Street

Comparing the criteria for a mid-block crossing and the characteristics of the proposed MLK, a marked crossing is appropriate. Volumes are near the upper desired limit, but the posted speed limit at 35 MPH is appropriate. With the volume of projected pedestrians and the distance to the nearest crosswalks, pedestrians would most likely walk across the street mid-block unprotected. Most pedestrian crossings will occur outside of the AM and PM peak hours. The appropriate treatment for this type of roadway is to install pedestrian activated rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFB). A median with a refuge island of eight feet or greater is also recommended.

CONCLUSION

As part of the proposed Walmart campus, a mid-block pedestrian crossing is proposed across Martin Luther King, Jr. Parkway (MLK) between 5th Street and 8th Street. This crossing will provide pedestrian access between the Layout Building east of MLK and the main campus west of MLK. After reviewing the accepted criteria, a mid-block crossing is recommended with the following treatments:

- Two-stage crossing with refuge island of eight feet wide or greater
- Two sets of pedestrian activated RRFBs, one set for crossing each direction of traffic
- Appropriate lighting
- Proper sight-distance. No obstructions from landscaping
- Marked crosswalk with standard markings

I wanted to talk to the Traffic Safety and Signage committee about this option to see what criteria would need to be met in order for a neighborhood to request a street closure. I'm under the impression it's not generally supported, but maybe if there are some parameters to keep them safe and accessible for emergency vehicles, that we could provide those to the neighborhoods on the front end.

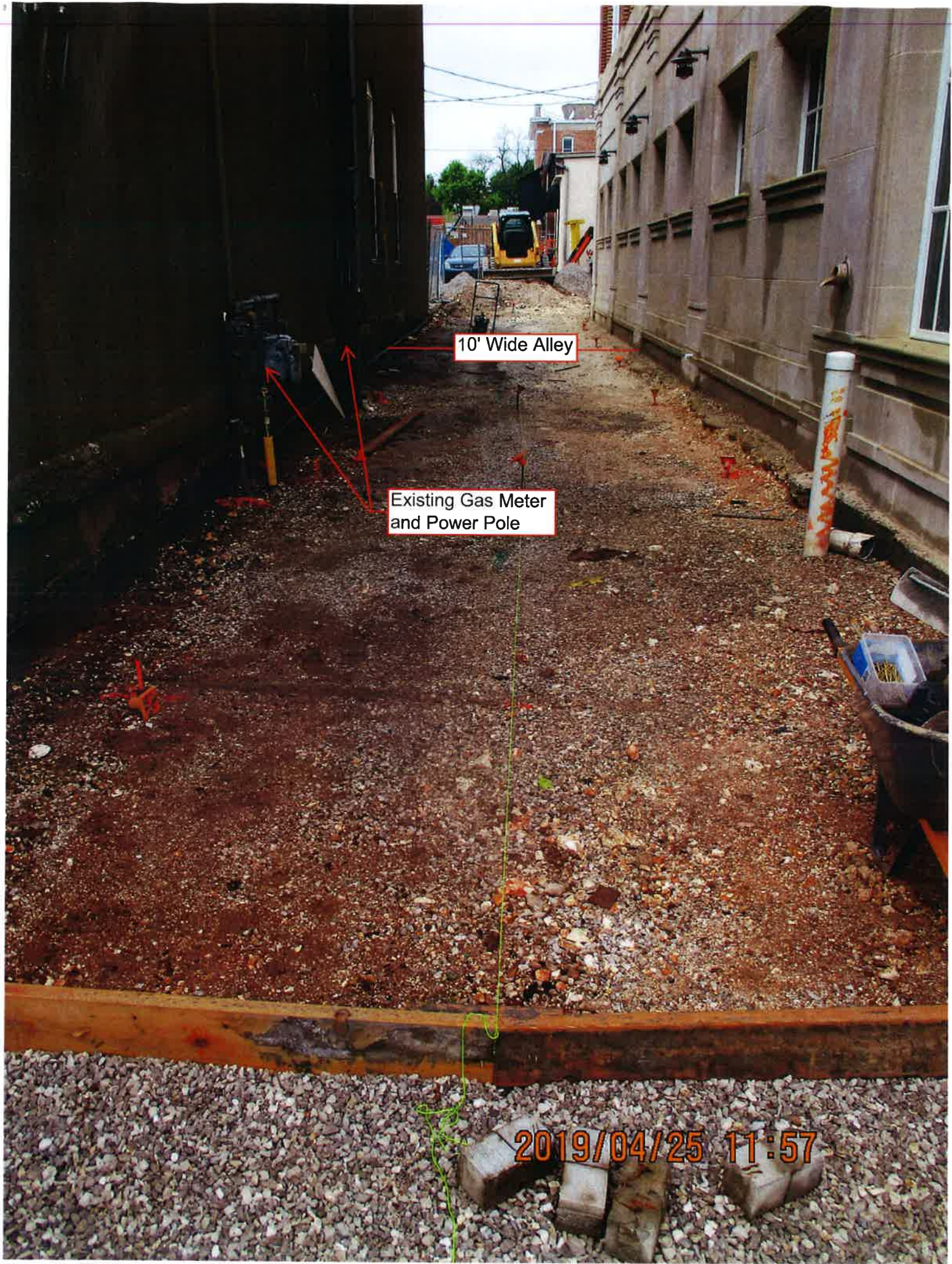
