MINUTES

I. OLD BUSINESS/TABLED ITEMS:

- A. Jason Stringfellow – 5201 SW Blairemont Road, Bentonville – Phone: (904) 962-8385**

With the addition of Lochmoor Phase 3 and Edgar Estates, it has been observed that there is (1) fast traffic (above limits), (2) lack of posted limits, and (3) increased construction/general traffic throughout Lochmoor Club Phase I (namely long run/convenience roads Edinburgh Ave and Blairemont Rd). The roads have become a dangerous “cut through” that would normally travel Bright Road-Gator-SW “H” Street. Requesting traffic calming services in the form of (1) additional posted speed limit/children signs, and three-way stop signs and/or (2) the installation of speed bumps/humps, and/or (3) temp/perm speed awareness detection equipment as deemed possible by the City.

May Action: Mr. Stringfellow attended the meeting and the committee discussed his concerns. David Mills made a motion to table until the June meeting so he could get traffic counts and speeds in this area, and update any signage that is needed. In the meantime, the police will exercise more presence in this area for speeders. Dennis Birge seconded the motion. This will be put on the June agenda. Motion approved.

June 7th - Traffic Analysis Report Attached

Action: Mr. Stringfellow attended the meeting via Zoom. This item was tabled from the May meeting to get traffic and speed counts. The street department did take the counts, but the results did not call for any other traffic calming measures. However, there was a motion and second by Dennis Birge and Cindy Acree to update any needed signage that are needed, such as speed limit signs, Children At Play signs, etc. The Police Department will get some additional traffic enforcement out there, and the radar trailer will be placed in this area. Motion passed.

Brittany Road is the main throughway for two (2) neighborhoods. As a parent of two young boys, I am concerned for their safety since many cars do not obey the posted speed limits. I believe two main problems are causing this:

1) The link between the two neighborhoods rolls over a hill. This causes people to come over the hill much too fast.

2) This road is a main throughway/alternative route for Greenhouse Road traffic. This causes construction and commercial traffic to remain high and inattentive of existing speed signs.

Request/Recommendation: Speed bumps, digital speed tracking signs, police patrols, additional/more visible signage.

May Action: David Mills made a motion to table this matter to the June meeting so he could obtain speed and traffic counts through the area. Dennis Birge seconded. Motion passed. This will be put on the June agenda.

June 7th – *Traffic Analysis Report Attached*

Action: Mr. Snow appeared before the Committee via Zoom. This matter was tabled from the May meeting to take traffic and speed counts. The Street Department did take the counts and the results did not warrant any other traffic calming measures. However, Dennis Birge and Cindy Acree made a motion and second to update any needed signage, the Police Department will add the radar trailer to this area, and give this neighborhood additional traffic enforcement. Motion passed. Chief Simpson told him to call the Police Department if he observes any traffic violations in progress and they would see what they could do.

Epic Rides in partnership with Visit Bentonville is producing the third edition of Oz Trails Off-Road. We are requesting to present to the Committee our plan for temporary street closures and rolling closures sought to execute the event over the weekend of October 15 – 17, 2021. *Maps Attached.*

Action: Aimee Ross appeared in person and Dave Castro appeared via Zoom. They went over the races that were going to be held and the areas were looked at by the Committee on the screen. Applicant indicated that no police are needed around the town, unless they see the need. They are working with the Benton County Sheriff's Office to help with the County portion of the races. David Wright indicated that he thought all of this would be okay. Chief Simpson said they would need to keep in touch with us as time passes and that changes could happen. The applicants agreed. A motion and second was made by David Wright and Cindy Acree to approve with a reconsideration if anything changes.

Requested by the Fire Chief – Close NE A Street between SE 2nd and Central Avenue for pedestrian traffic on Thursday, 08-05-21 through Sunday, 08-08-21. There will be approximately 1000 people walking between Tucker’s Corner and the Square for First Friday and Bentonville Film Festival.

Please Note: Closure will not include the parking lot entrance. See attached map.

Action: Cheri Jones appeared via Zoom as representative of the Bentonville Film Festival, in its 7th year of operation. She said that her words on the attached map are correct, but that she marked a block down from where she needed to. The closure is from SE 2nd to SW 2nd in front of the Courthouse. Everyone understood that. Most of their events take place around Tucker’s Corner. It was also noted that they would need to check with the Court System at the Courthouse to make sure that their events will not hinder or interfere with any court hearings. The applicants will contact them and make sure that they will not bother them at all. If they need to turn down the music, they will do that. They will need to contact local business owners around the area to make sure they are okay with everything. There was a motion by David Mills and second by Cindy Acree to tentatively grant this request as long as we receive emails or notes from the businesses and/or court officials that they are okay with the events happening. This will happen the first week of August. Motion passed.

Action: Debbie Griffin appeared before the Committee in person. She had a request come through her office to look at 115 W. Central from the 3-Dog Bakery and First Seat. There is an alley and they request that the alley become a Pedestrian Only alley and to change the One Way Only sign to Pedestrian Only, and Blue Crane requests they be allowed to extend the lighting down the alley at their expense, however, this is not part of today’s request. It was brought up that this alley is and stays city property. The question came up whether to put up a bollard or not to keep traffic from going through the alley. David Mills said we need a bollard and the committee thinks it is a good move. The requestor will be responsible to install the bollard, and the current signage will be taken down once this is done. Cindy Acree made a motion to approve this request with the recommendations of public safety, adding the bollard and to take the signage down. Motion passed.

We have installed a parklet in front of our business per the city ordinance that was extended through August 31, 2021. We were recently informed by our ABC agent that our ability to serve alcohol outside with the current temporary permit expires on June 1, 2021 when COVID restrictions will be lifted. We are requesting permission from the city to obtain permission to use the sidewalk as part of our business in order to take advantage of the parklet and serve beer and wine outside through the summer.

Attached is the original permit expansion we submitted to ABC, which shows the footprint of our outdoor seating space. It includes the sidewalk and two parking spaces in front of the business. We have an encroachment agreement with the city to use these spaces.

Action: This is actually at SW “B” Street where Two Friends Books/Café is located. After discussion, the Committee decided that this was a decision for this Committee to make. She was told that she may need to contact the Planning Department. Ellen Norvell said that Planning stays completely out of the

decision about walking across the sidewalk to serve alcohol. That is the decision of the ABC. It was decided that we are not able to help her. No action taken.

The Mayor asked the applicant to reach out to the Director of the ABC and give her plans to them and they will give you the exact direction she needs to take. We cannot speak for them and you will need to get permission from them.

There was a recommendation, and the Committee agreed, that this matter is not a Traffic & Signage issue is a Planning issue and ABC issue. Ellen Norvell added that Planning Department is not going to close a public sidewalk for private use.

Seeking approval for Arkansas Razorback Greenway Trail Detour (West Route), which includes detour signage for way finding of pedestrians (bicycle and foot traffic) during Walmart Campus construction. See attached exhibits.

Action: approval for an additional connection for pedestrian, bicycle traffic to link the greenways just south of the high school at the greenway location. After some discussion as to which street would be the best, the Committee and Mr. Muse had different opinions. Mr. Muse said that because of campus construction, they are trying provide another connection. This would take up to May of 2025. Ms. Acree asked if they could have a more focused presentation on this as there was a lot to consider. David Wright said that once all of this is complete it will be worth the wait, but he brought up that maybe going north to 18th Street might be better use instead of going back south, and have less impact. Dennis Birge indicated that there are obstacles of an electric pole, narrowing of the sidewalk.

Action: There was a motion by Cindy Acree to table this matter until July, so we could look at the 18th Street option. Brent Boydston requested we get Jim to make us some big maps of the areas involved. Dennis Birge seconded. Motion passed.

As we plan to use our parking lot for the ceremony and ribbon cutting, we would like to request a permit to close off a section of SE John Rollow Dr. (as indicated in the attachment map b) for the duration of the event to allow parking and foot traffic to be at a minimize disturbance. We are the only property in the entire area of the street and the rest all vacant fields. Therefore, this should not affect anyone else during the said time, and traffic in the area is extremely low on a Sunday afternoon. Rabbi Greisman also requested two officers to help with any traffic difficulties during this event.

Action: After discussion, Cindy Acree made the motion to approve the applicant's request. David Wright made a second to her motion. Motion passed.

Action: Motion made by David Mills to table this matter to take traffic counts and speeds. Chief Simpson told the applicant to make sure that she and her neighbors do not park on the street this next month so we can get correct speeds. Cindy Acree gave a second to the motion. Motion passed.

III. ADDITIONAL BUSINESS:

Phyllis Street discussion. David Mills obtained traffic and speed counts on this street.

David Mills brought this matter back to the Committee. He explained that after putting up 25 mph signs and doing traffic counts, he thought maybe raising the speed limit to 30 or 35 mph would be better.

Action: David Mills and Cindy Acree made a motion and second to raise the speed limit to 35 mph. Motion passed.

Brent Boydston asked if anyone else was have a problem trying to drive down NW 3rd at 25 mph. David Mills explained that after redesign, it is going to be narrower and have bike lanes, so that should help the speeding. Dennis Birge reiterated David's comments and there was other discussion. It was said that the new light has not made much difference in the speeds. Captain Shastid said that he has had his officers out and wrote a handful of tickets. David Mills said that after the re-design, we could revisit NW Third and see what the committee could do.

B. Camille Thompson – Staff Attorney – Legal Department

Slow Streets and the traffic flow during First Friday and Farmer's Market, and the interrelationship between the Slow Streets and vehicular traffic trying to avoid the closed streets, and congestion on the Square. Specifically, those vehicles that tend to drive through what are now the expended Slow Streets areas. The Mayor expressed concern and that she had personally observes difficulties several times over the weekend. Also, a fire truck seemed to be having difficulty navigating the area.

Camille just reiterated what is above that Mayor and Councilwoman Acree had noticed. She spoke with Andrew Heath and he had not noticed any problems. The Mayor had said that she thought people were confused and that they should not be in these areas. In addition, Brent Boydston said his guys had some difficulty. They went from A-Frame signs to steel poles, 6 ft tall, in the middle of the intersection. His fire trucks cannot make that turn and the signs are going to have to go. Camille asked David Wright if he and Josh could approach someone about this. There were other types of signs suggested.

Cindy Acree brought up that maybe signage needs to be changed. She thinks that motorists are confused and are not seeing signage until after they have already turned. Then they think they are not supposed to be there. Mr. Heath said Slow Streets is almost over. He said they are only going through June. David Wright said that he would make a phone call or two and let us know what he found out.
