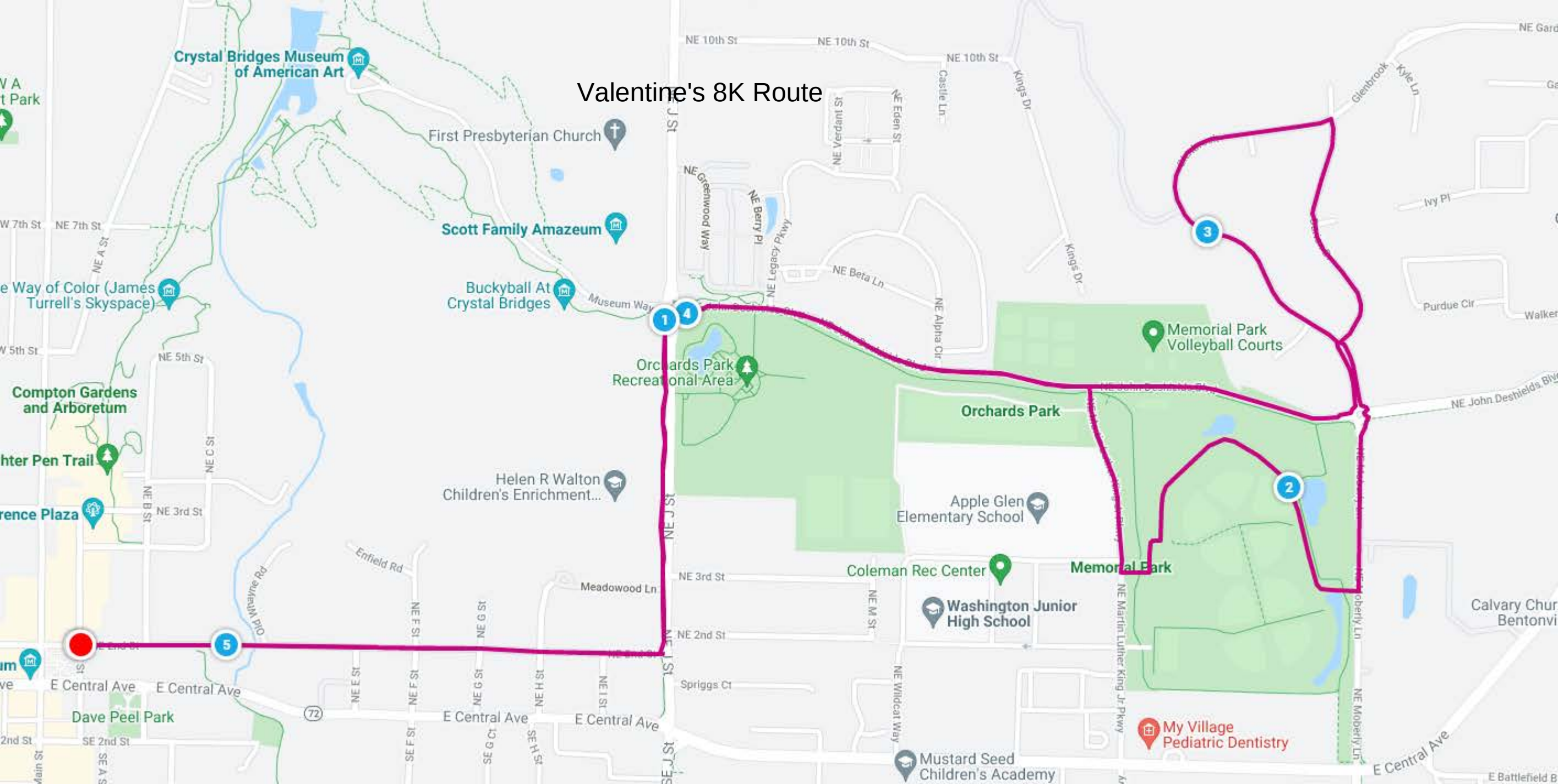

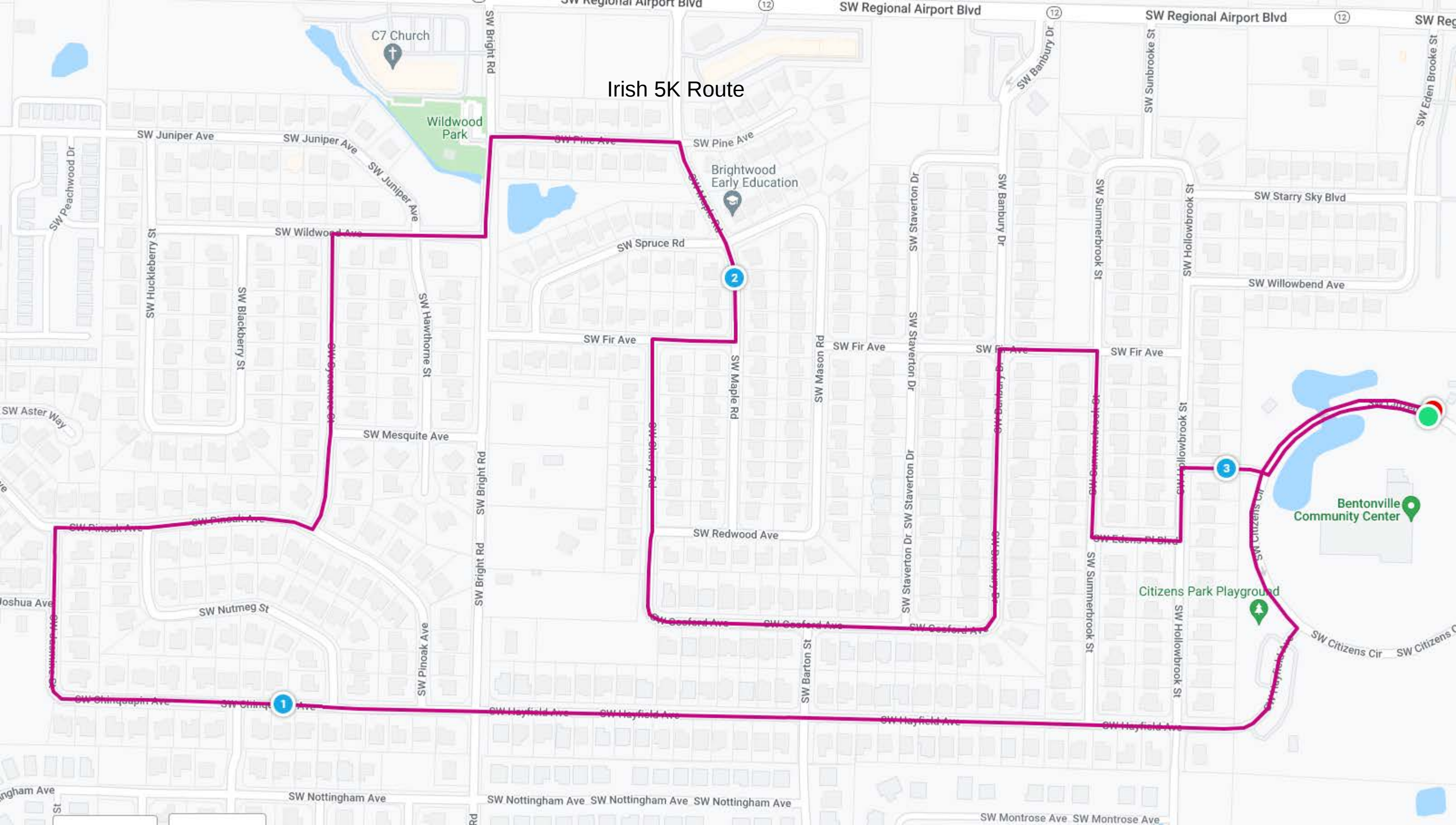
Valentine's 4K Route



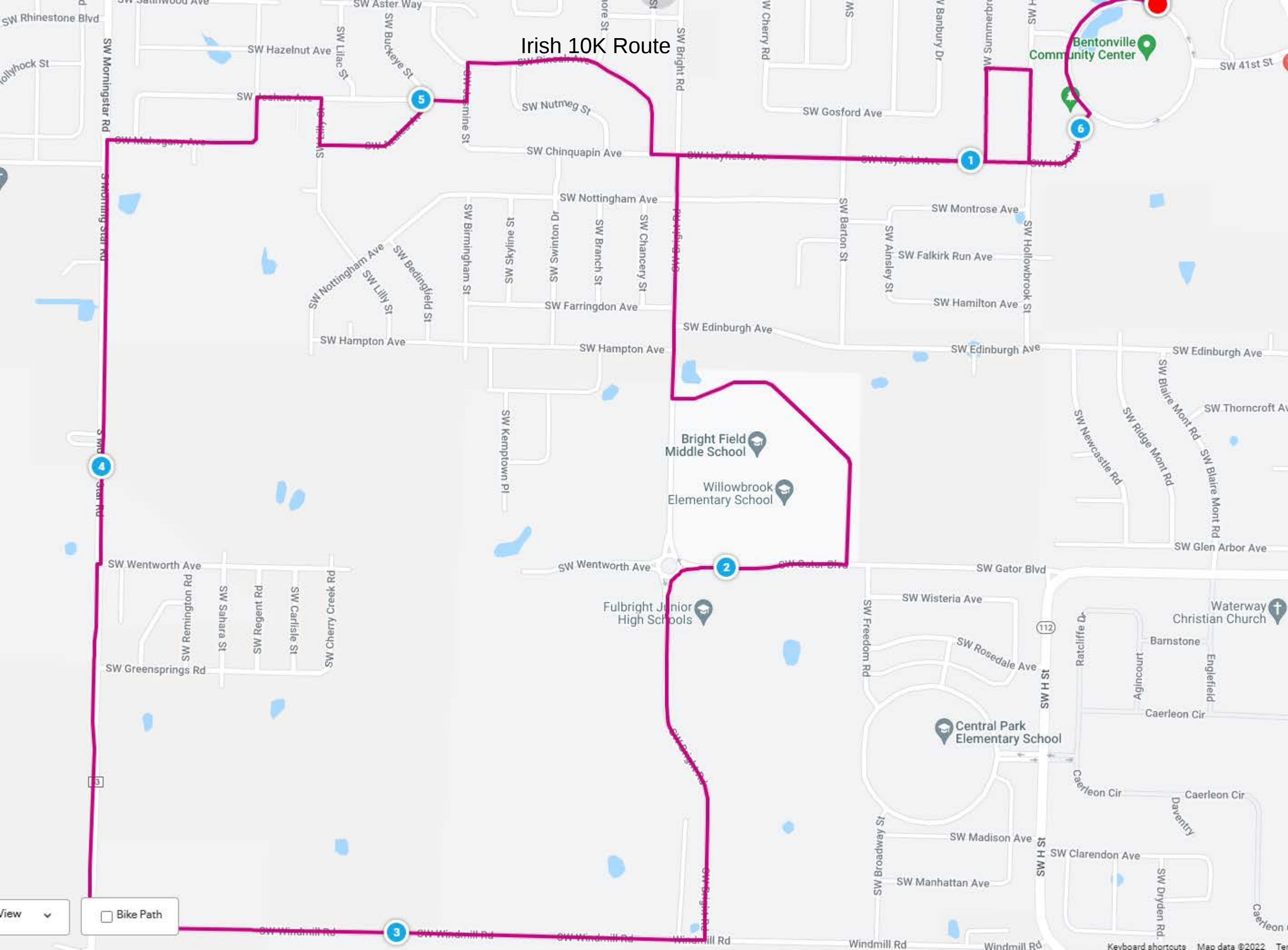
Valentine's 8K Route

Big Sugar Gravel is a bicycle event that is scheduled to take place from Thursday, October 20 through Saturday, October 22, 2022. The event consists of two components: an industry trade expo set for Friday with set-up on Thursday and a gravel road bicycle race on Saturday. The bike race includes two distance options: 50 miles or 100 miles. All components of the event will be based around the Bentonville downtown square.

The following document presents the event's proposed schedule, maps of the expo and race day footprints including necessary road closures, the race course maps, and details of the exits and entries from Bentonville.

We are requesting road closures from Thursday morning through to Saturday night, allowing event equipment to remain on the streets and be protected throughout the weekend. We are also requesting the assistance of the Bentonville Police Department to coordinate with Benton County Sheriff's Office on a police escort for the two race starts at 7:30am and 8:30am Saturday morning. Our last request is for the presence of a city Emergency Medical Services employee on site to provide any needed small medical aid and to assist in communication with the EMS department in the case that greater medical services are needed.

Bentonville Public Library, along with partners and friends, will host 2nd Annual OZ Kids™ Fat Tire Crit & Fall Fest on October 22, 2022 from 3– 7PM. The festival is free and open to all; to participate in the crit, a small registration fee will apply. The Library anticipates 1,500 people in attendance.

The festival and criterium takes place in the public library's backyard, SE 4th Street and adjacent downtown city streets. The program requires full street closures for the duration of the event, as well as set up and tear down. BPL requests Noon – 9PM street closures, as well as Police and Paramedic support so the event will be safe and fun for all. Refer to attachment for course options/maps for streets affected and specific closure times.

This year's race in Bentonville is a culminating championship race, building on races in Rogers, Springdale and Fayetteville. Racers are youth ages 2 – 11 with a regular rotation of races every 15 minutes, consisting of eleven categories.

Last year, the crit's inaugural year, was extremely successful with approximately 1,500 participants enjoying all facets of the celebratory offerings. Stories, crafts, music, food, yoga and biking activities were provided. Pedal It Forward distributed more than 80 free bikes to community kids. More than 300 children raced with age and gender winner awards provided.

- 45 minutes for cleanup

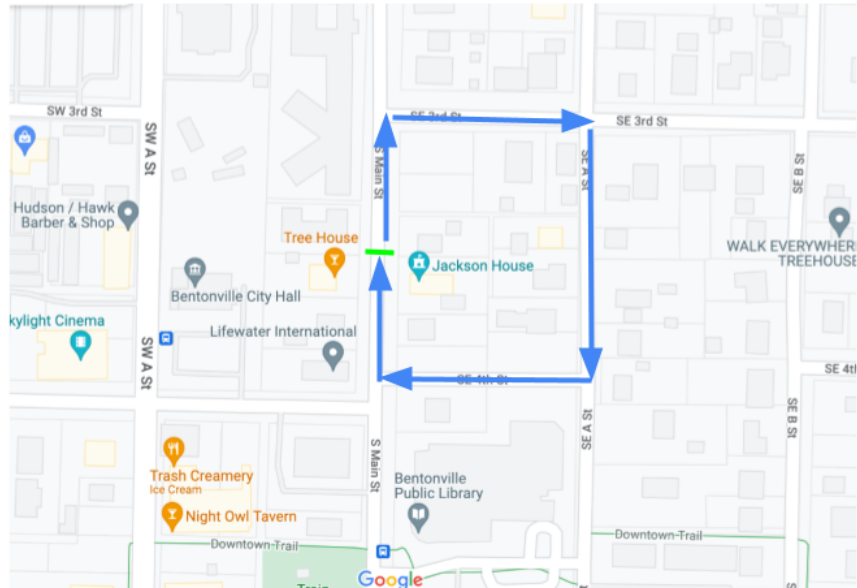

Preferred Race Course:

1st Choice

Start Finish on Main between 3rd and 4th, North to 3rd, East to SE A, South to SE 4th, then North on S Main to the finish. 4th street will also need to be closed for the festival and traffic.



Alternate Race Course #1:

2nd Choice*

Start Finish on Main between 3rd and 4th, North to 3rd, East to SE A, South to Library parking lot, then North on S Main to the finish. 4th street will also need to be closed for the festival and traffic.
