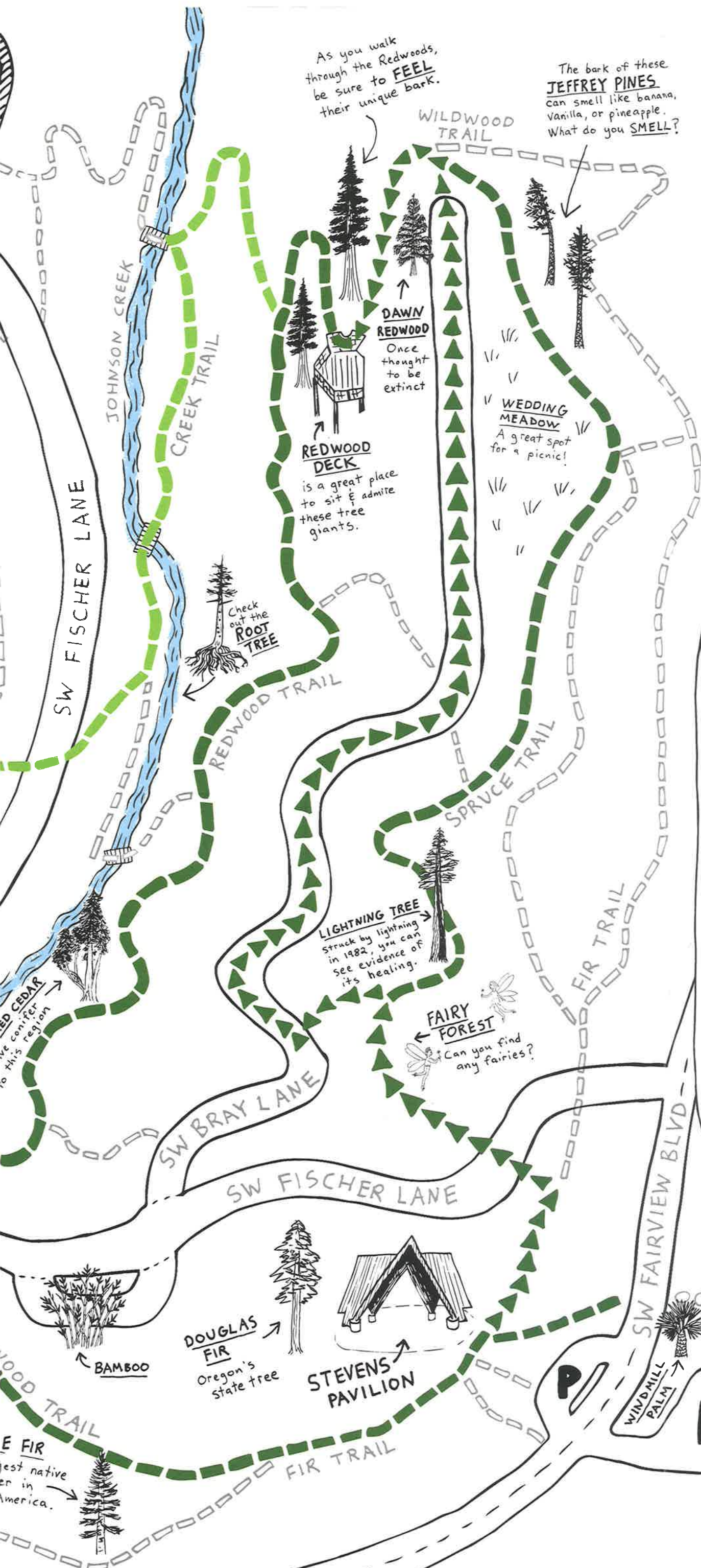

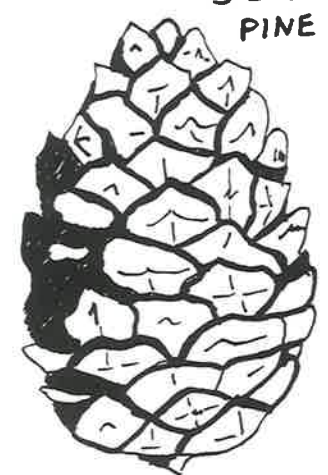

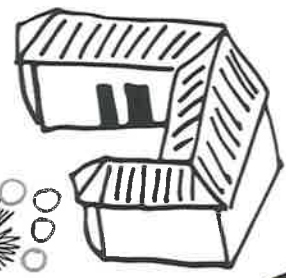

TRAILS

- REDWOOD LOOP** (0.9 miles)
Take the Spruce Trail up to the Redwood Deck. Return along the Redwood Trail.
- STROLLER ROUTE** (0.8 miles)
Begin along the Spruce Trail. Take a connector trail to Bray Lane, and then out to the Redwood Deck.
- EXTENDED ROUTE** (0.4 miles)
Explore the Creek Trail and parts of Bristlecone Pine and White Pine trails.
- ACCESSIBLE ROUTE** (0.5 miles)
Accessible parking on Fischer Lane. Take the paved section of the Bristlecone Pine Trail.
