Dear Mr. Earl:

Bids were received for the Compost Facility Improvements project at the City's Purchasing Office at 11:00 a.m. on December 14, 2022. The bids have been checked for accuracy and for compliance with the contract documents, and the lowest base bid submitted, including Deductive Alternate 1, is considered unbalanced per below. A tabulation of the bids received is enclosed with this letter.

Although we had eight plan holders registered as contractors, only two bids were received on the project. One bid (CDI Contractors) was approximately one minute late and not accepted, and it was stressed at mandatory pre-bid conference that the 11:00 a.m. deadline would be strictly enforced. Based upon discussions with CDI Contractors, their bid would have been the highest bid.

Per the attached bid tabulation, the lowest base bid was submitted by Seven Valleys Concrete. The lowest base bid less deductive alternate 1 was submitted by Crossland Heavy Contractors. However, the bid price for Item 2 (composting equipment only excluding labor and installation) is unbalanced for Seven Valleys Concrete. The equipment cost is approximately \$1 million per the manufacture, and Seven Valleys Concrete bid price for Item 2 was \$2,850,000. The bid for Item 2 by Crossland Heavy Contractors was \$1,052,300. Bid Item 2 was intended to confirm the manufacture provided similar equipment quotes to bidders, balanced bids. The bid by Seven Valleys Concrete is not considered responsive, and the Instruction to Bidders states that the City reserves the right to reject unbalanced bids. Minor informalities, not involving price, can be waived. Also, the bid for Deductive Alternate 1 by Seven Valleys Concrete (\$38,000) is also unbalanced per Garver's final design opinion of probable construction cost (\$110,000). The bid received by Crossland Heavy Contractors for Deductive Alternate 1 was \$138,100.

The lowest responsive bid submitted by Crossland Heavy Contractors was in the amount of \$3,298,900. Garver's Final Design Opinion of Probable Cost was \$3,074,000, without any contingency. Garver recommends not taking deductive alternate 1, elimination of Facility 20 Storage Canopy. Crossland Heavy Contractors did not make a written claim for Arkansas based preference with their bid, within 5 percent per procurement requirements.

Garver recommends confirming Garver recommendations with City purchasing and legal counsel.

Garver recommends awarding the construction contract for the total base bid price to Crossland Heavy Contractors. The lowest responsive bid represents a good value for the City of Bentonville.

The equipment cost is approximately \$1 million per the manufacture, and Seven Valleys Concrete bid price for Item 2 was \$2,850,000. 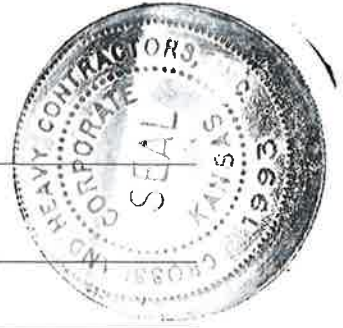

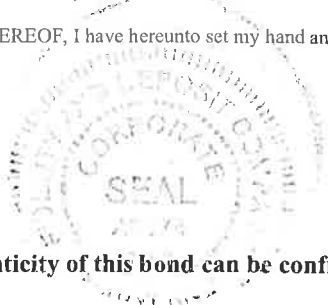

This Amendment No. 2 adds/modifies the Services for the compost facility improvements located adjacent to the Bentonville Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF) at 1901 NE A Street. Amendment No. 2 adds Construction Phase Services for a single construction contract.

The Agreement is hereby modified as follows:

Task 6 – Construction Services

Section 6 of the Agreement is hereby amended to follow:

Omit "~~The scope for this task will be developed and authorized by future Amendments.~~"

During the construction phase of work, Garver will accomplish the following:

- A. Issue a Notice to Proceed letter to the Contractor and attend preconstruction meeting.
- B. Attend up to three progress/coordination meetings with the Owner/Contractor.
- C. Evaluate and respond to construction material submittals and shop drawings. Corrections or comments made by Garver on the shop drawings during this review will not relieve Contractor from compliance with requirements of the drawings and specifications. The check will only be for review of general conformance with the design concept of the Project and general compliance with the information given in the contract documents. The Contractor will be responsible for confirming and correlating all quantities and dimensions, selecting fabrication processes and techniques of construction, coordinating his work with that of all other trades, and performing his work in a safe and satisfactory manner. Garver's review shall not constitute approval of safety precautions or constitute approval of construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or assembly of various components. When certification of performance characteristics of materials, systems or equipment is required by the Contract Documents, either directly or implied for a complete and workable system, Garver shall be entitled to rely upon such submittal or implied certification to establish that the materials, systems or equipment will meet the performance criteria required by the Contract Documents.
- D. Issue instructions to the Contractor on behalf of the Owner and issue necessary clarifications (respond to RFIs) regarding the construction contract documents.
- E. Review the Contractor's progress payment requests based on the actual quantities of contract items completed and accepted and will make a recommendation to the Owner regarding payment. Garver's recommendation for payment shall not be a representation that Garver has made exhaustive or continuous inspections to (1) check the quality or exact quantities of the Work; (2) to review billings from Subcontractors and material suppliers to substantiate the Contractor's right to payment; or (3) to ascertain how the Contractor has



used money previously paid to the Contractor.

- F. Prepare and furnish record drawings based upon Contractor's redlines. Garver will provide the Owner one full size set of record drawings and pdf.
- G. Provide part-time resident construction observation services for the 300-calendar-day construction contract performance time. The proposed fee is based on up to 100 hours of inspection during the 300-calendar-day construction contract performance time. If the construction time extends beyond the time established in this agreement or if the Owner wishes to increase the time or frequency of the observation, the Owner will pay Garver an additional fee agreed to by the Owner and Garver.
- H. Provide up to 8 hours of survey crew time for field checking quantities, contractor's layout, etc.
- I. When authorized by the Owner, prepare change orders for changes in the work from that originally provided for in the construction contract documents. If redesign or substantial engineering or surveying is required in the preparation of these change order documents, the Owner will pay Garver an additional fee to be agreed upon by the Owner and Garver.
- J. Participate in a substantial and final Project inspection, prepare punch list, review final Project closing documents, and submit final pay request.

Construction observation services will be provided by Garver's Resident Project Representative, who will provide or accomplish the following:

- K. Consult with and advise the Owner during the construction period.
- L. Coordinate with the firm providing construction materials quality assurance testing under separate contract with the Contractor.
- M. Maintain a file of quantities incorporated into the work, test reports, certifications, shop drawings and submittals, and other appropriate information.

The proposed fee for Construction Phase Services is based on a 300-calendar-day construction contract performance time. If the construction time extends beyond the time established in this agreement, and the Owner wants Garver to continue the applicable Construction Phase Services, the Owner will pay Garver an additional fee agreed to by the Owner and Garver.

In performing construction observation services, Garver will endeavor to protect the Owner against defects and deficiencies in the work of the Contractor(s); but Garver cannot guarantee the performance of the Contractor(s), nor be responsible for the actual supervision of construction operations or for the safety measures that the Contractor(s) takes or should take. However, if at any time during construction Garver observes that the Contractor's work does not comply with the construction contract documents, Garver will notify the Contractor of such non-compliance and instruct him to correct the deficiency and/or stop work, as appropriate for the situation. Garver will also record the observance, the discussion, and the actions taken. If the Contractor continues without satisfactory corrective action, Garver will notify the Owner immediately, so that appropriate action under the Owner's contract with the Contractor can be taken.

Task 9 – Extra Work

Section 9 of the Agreement is hereby amended to follow:

Omit ~~(i) Construction Services of any kind.~~

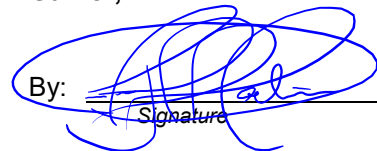
