Meeting Minutes

January 14, 2025



The City Council of Bentonville, Arkansas, met in regular session Tuesday, January 14, at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall, 305 S.W. A Street, Bentonville, Arkansas.

Present were Council Members Octavio Sanchez, Beckie Seba, Cindy Acree, Holly Hook, Chris Sooter, Aubrey Patterson, Gayatri Agnew and Bill Burckart. Also present were Mayor Stephanie Orman, City Attorney Nicholas Henry, City Clerk Malorie Marrs, the press, city staff, and the audience. Several members of the city staff and the public attended remotely via Zoom.

Mayor Orman called the meeting to order, and a Scout Member from Troop 36, led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance, which was followed by a moment of silence in support of our armed forces.

Drawing out a plan for what this looks like, and it is communicated through the proper channels.

Council and the Mayor discussed these points in length, and are addressing them, through staff, and potential various future meetings.

Council Member Sanchez- Library Board: Met, and is preparing a study for a fee structure

of establishing a fee structure for the free rooms. As there has been people reserving the rooms, and not showing up. This would be for the big rooms, not the study rooms.

Council Member Acree-Traffic and Signage: Sidewalk completion status, talking about where to finish the sidewalks to make crosswalks. Approved the Jack Rabbit Run. A lot of older buildings during remodels will remove their parking for construction.

Council Member Seba- Public Art: Has moved their meetings, but has a new appointment as of tonight. Airport: Had a special meeting regarding the usage of a hanger for the ignite program

Council Member Sooter-Parks & Recreation: Master Plan for Memorial Park, Old School House at Morning Star, might be a place for a new park

Council Member Agnew-Finance: Working on a master calendar, finalizing the ORT Contract, 3rd Tuesday of every month will be the active transportation committee-had 30 applicants.
