**Bentonville Parks and Recreation
Advisory Board Meeting
October 17, 2016**

The Bentonville Parks and Recreation Advisory Board met September 19, 2016 at the Downtown Activity Center.

Present were members Holly Hook, Chris Sooter, Tom McCoy, Courtney Schaefer, Amy Davis, and Mike Power. Lee Farmer, David Wright, and Angel Stuler were present for the staff.

Meeting began at 5:08PM

Old Business

1. Approval of Minutes from July meeting
 - Motion to approve by Hook
 - Sooter seconded the motion
 - Approved 5-0
2. Update – Trail Marking Plan – North Walton Trail
 - Wright updated PRAB on the trail marking plan for the North Walton Trail.

New Business

1. Budget Discussion 2017
 - Wright updated PRAB with the 2017 budget. Wright passed out paperwork that included the 2015, 2016, and the proposed 2017 budget. It indicates the budget increases/decrease for each account. Wildwood Park Rename – Osage Park
2. Capital Improvement Project Update
 - Wright updated PRAB regarding current Capital projects such as the Citizens Park Trail plan review and the MFAC Pool House Renovation plan review.
3. Public Art Committee Approval – OHMS School Proposal for CC
 - Artwork would be installed from the exposed steel beams outside of the Bentonville Community Center to the left of the front/main entrance. The project was inspired by Patrick Shearn's Liquid Shard installation in Los Angeles, CA. This particular art piece at the BCC would be done by the 5th and 6th grade art students of Old High Middle School. The art will create a collaborative, temporary, hanging display with a holiday theme. The proposed dates for the installation are November 28th-December 26th. Power made the motion to approve and McCoy seconded the motion. Motion was approved 6-0.
4. Public Art Committee Approval – Tunnel Vision at Crystal Bridges Trail
 - Art for the tunnel by Crystal Bridges was approved by the Public Art Committee and was sent to PRAB for approval. This particular art piece is a series of murals for the tunnel walls that are colorful, vibrant and fun according to the artist. PRAB liked the art pieces but didn't think they fit this particular area of the trail. They felt it would be better served at the Skate Park or the Memorial Park Ball

fields where the theme would fit better. Sooter gave the motion to not approve the location and be taken back to the Public Art Committee, (with the request of a different location for the art) and this was approved by PRAB 5-1.

5. Other Business

- Wright told PRAB the Bentonville Community Center was awarded as the “Recreation Facility of the Year” at the Arkansas Recreation & parks Associations Annual Conference.
- Wright updated PRAB with the Master Plan Meetings. There were about 6-7 focus group meetings and they all went very well. In addition, the public meeting has close to 60 people. A survey will soon go out and sent to 3,000 random residents (a control group so that we have consistent and accurate data). After this, we will advertise to everyone and ask for feedback. At the end of October, the Master Planners will come back and they’ll look at areas we’re lacking parks and we should have a 1st draft by the end of January.
- Schaefer brought up Bentonville Community Center Annual Renewals. She was concerned that renewals were never sent out to members ahead of time whose yearly membership expired and those members were “surprised” when they showed up and were told their membership had expired. Farmer said he was unsure about this. Schaefer and other PRAB members asked that he look into this matter, because it’s pretty important. Schaefer said we potentially miss opportunities to stay ahead and we want to offer good customer service, and not miss revenue opportunities.

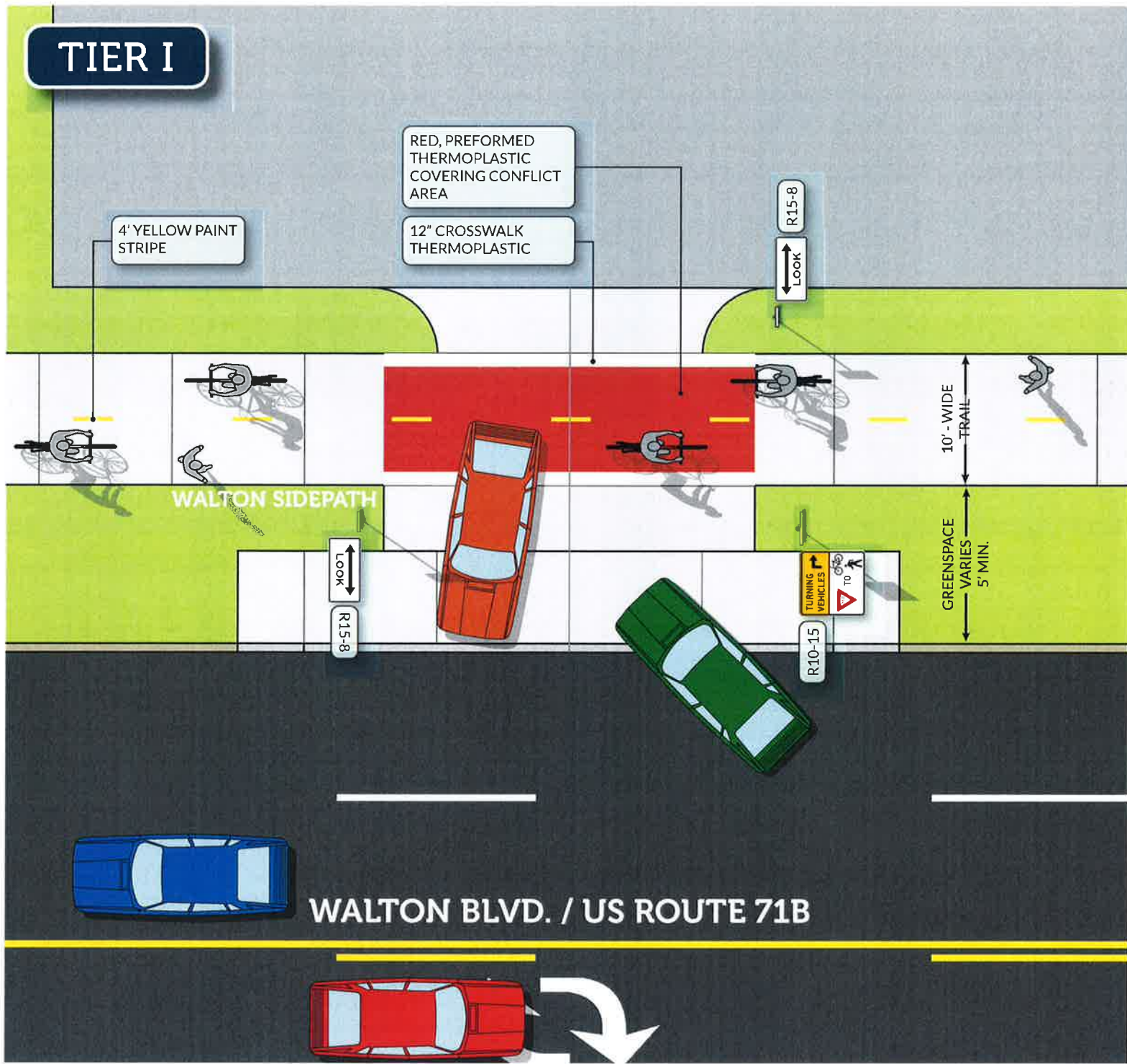

III. GUIDELINES

OVERVIEW

In this chapter, the guidelines for driveway crossings along the Walton Boulevard Sidepath are laid out for each of the different Tiers discussed in the previous chapter.

Tier I Driveways - Proposed Treatments

Tier I driveways feature the lowest traffic volumes of all the commercial driveways within the study area. The majority of these driveways feature small businesses limited to small parking areas, ranging from 8 to 10 parking stalls.

The proposed recommendations for the treating of Tier I driveways consist of:

- Installation of red thermoplastic, or red paint for a short-term solution, on the sidepath accenting the motorist - bicyclist/pedestrian conflict area. Red was decided upon due to the contrast with a whiter concrete of the sidepath, as well as the use of red being considered as a regional standard on driveway crossings in Northwest Arkansas.
- Installation of 12" solid white standard crosswalk markings on either side of the conflict area.
- Installation of 4"-wide, yellow centerline stripe. The centerline stripe is proposed to be dashed so sidepath users can continue travel even when motorists are blocking the sidepath. The sidepath is also runs parallel to Walton Blvd. and doesn't feature blind or sharp turns.
- Installation of "Turning Vehicles Yield" (MUTCD R10-15) and pedestrian-scale "Look" signs (MUTCD R15-8). Sidepath users have the right-of-way, but still have the responsibility to verify a safe time for crossing. Due to the volume of traffic at these driveways, users should have unimpeded traffic flow.

For Tier I destinations, please refer to the *Chapter I: Overview* section to understand the differences between and level of driveway treatment for driveways with familiar motorists versus unfamiliar motorists.

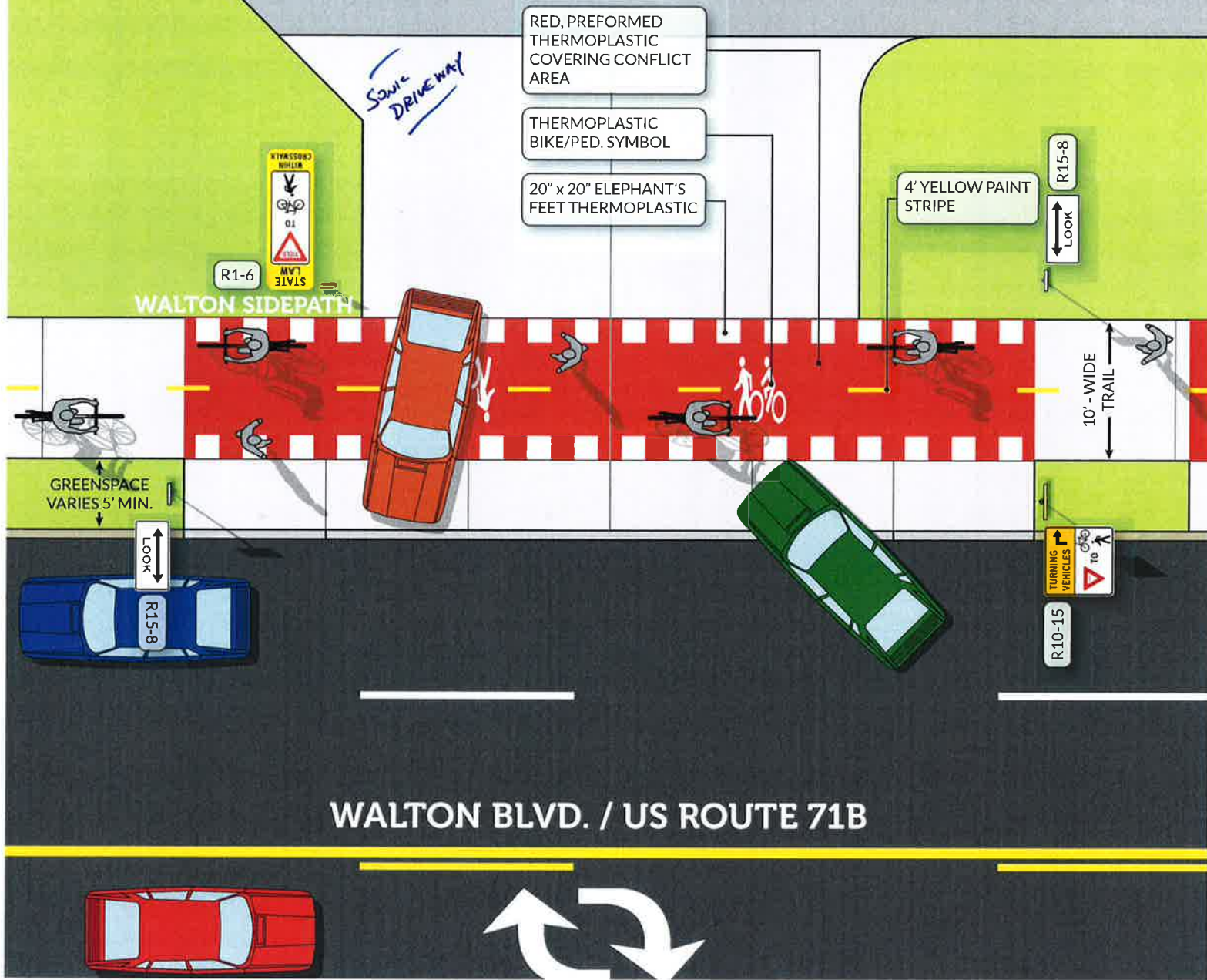

III. GUIDELINES

Tier II Driveways - Proposed Treatments

Tier II driveways feature average amounts of traffic for commercial driveways within the heart of a large commercial corridor. The majority of these driveways feature chain fast-food restaurants with multiple driveways, multi-tenant shopping centers, and parking areas ranging from 11 to 99 parking stalls.

The proposed recommendations for the treating of Tier II driveways consist of:

- Installation of red thermoplastic accenting the motorist - bicyclist/pedestrian conflict area.
- Installation of 20"x20" white, thermoplastic Elephant's Feet to increase the visibility of the conflict area.
- Installation of white, thermoplastic Bicyclist/ Pedestrian symbols oriented towards on-coming traffic.
- Installation of 4"-wide, yellow centerline stripe. The centerline stripe is proposed to be dashed so sidepath users can continue travel even when motorists are blocking the sidepath. The sidepath runs parallel to Walton Blvd. and doesn't feature blind or sharp turns.
- Installation of pedestrian-scale "Look" signs (MUTCD R15-8). It will be the responsibility of the sidepath user to verify a safe time to cross the conflict area.
- Installation of two vehicular-scaled signs:
 - 1.) Warning motorists making a right turn off of Walton Blvd. (MUTCD R10-15) to give right-of-way to pedestrians and cyclists;
 - 2.) Installation of State Law, Yield to Cyclists/ Pedestrians sign (MUTCD R1-6), so motorists accessing Walton Blvd. are fully aware they must give right-of-way to pedestrians and cyclists before accessing Walton Blvd.

Tier III Driveways - Proposed Treatments

Tier III driveways feature the highest traffic volumes of all the driveways within the study area. The driveways in Tier III are those associated to Walmart facilities within the study corridor and feature vast parking areas, with 100+ parking stalls.

The proposed recommendations for the treating of Tier III driveways consist of:

- Installation of red thermoplastic, or red paint for a short-term solution, on the sidepath, accenting the motorist - bicyclist/pedestrian conflict area.
- Installation of 20"x20" white, thermoplastic Elephant's Feet to increase the visibility of the conflict area.
- Installation of Yield Shark Teeth with black outline (to contrast the white concrete sidepath) on either side of the driveway conflict area, so motorists know they must yield before crossing the sidepath. To further enforce the need to yield, raised ceramic road reflectors are to be overlaid upon the Yield Shark Teeth, so motorists feel a change in travelway surface.
- Installation of white, thermoplastic Bicyclist/Pedestrian symbols oriented towards on-coming traffic.
- Installation of 4"-wide, yellow centerline stripe. The centerline stripe is proposed to be dashed so sidepath users can continue travel even when motorists are blocking the sidepath. The sidepath runs parallel to Walton Blvd. and doesn't feature blind or sharp turns.
- Re-construction of a raised curb median within the driveway, limiting movements to right-in and right-out. There are currently some medians in place, but APD recommends reforming these to accent the right turn only movements.

- Installation of pedestrian-scale "Intersection" (MUTCD W2-1) and "Look" signs (MUTCD R15-8). It will be the responsibility of the sidepath user to verify a safe time to cross the conflict area.
- Installation of two vehicular-scaled signs:
 - 1.) Warning motorists making a right turn off of Walton Blvd. (MUTCD R10-15) to give right-of-way to pedestrians and cyclists;
 - 2.) Installation of State Law, Yield to Cyclists/Pedestrians sign (MUTCD R1-6), so motorists accessing Walton Blvd. are fully aware they must give right-of-way to pedestrians and cyclists before accessing Walton Blvd.

The businesses corresponding to Tier III driveways, from the south end of the study area to the north terminus, are:

III. GUIDELINES

Signalized Crossings

Signalized crossings along the Walton Boulevard Sidepath, such as the Walmart Supercenter main entry drive, will control right-of-way through use of vehicular traffic signals and pedestrian specific signals ("ped heads"). These signals are in place and there is no need to add any additional treatments. However, a ped head should be proposed at the Lee Scott Drive crossing leading to the Walmart Transportation/Logistics offices. This drive is most frequently used and should be treated in the same manner as the Walmart Supercenter main driveway.

Street Crossings

Major street crossings, like Central Ave., will be controlled by a vehicular and pedestrian specific traffic signals (see previous section). In comparison, where the Walton Boulevard Sidepath crosses typical, low-volume residential streets, pedestrians and cyclists will be forced to stop using pedestrian-scaled Stop Signs (MUTCD R1-1, 24" x 24" size) before crossing the roadway. Also, the yellow centerline will shift from dashed to solid in these situations. This concept will be the guiding force for a long-term solution discussed in the next chapter.

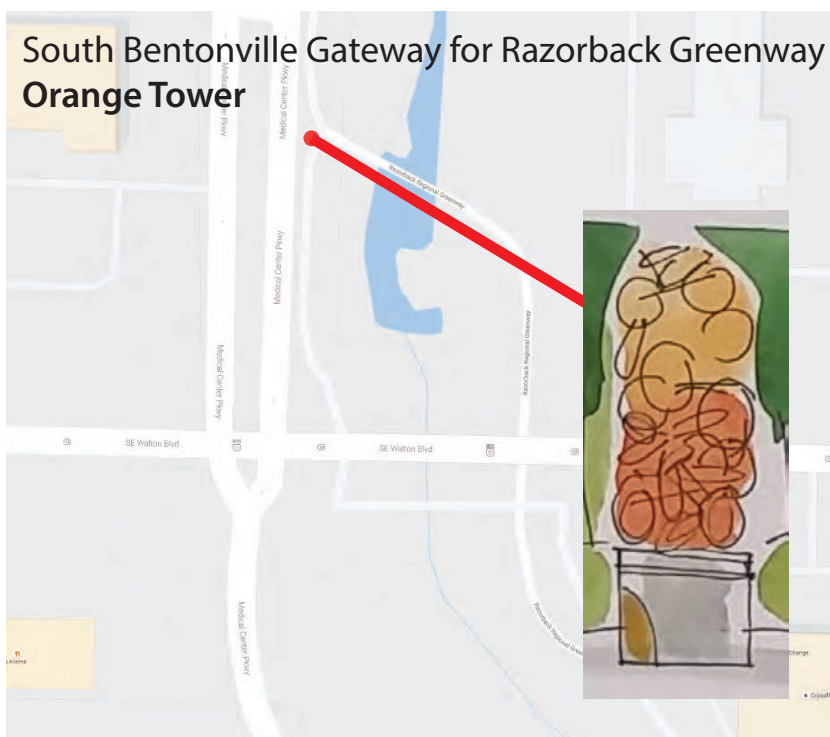
